

## WORLD - THE DAY AHEAD

MUNICH, AUG 21 (CNR) -- THE ENTRY OF ARMED FORCES OF THE SOVIET UNION, HUNGARY, POLAND, BULGARIA AND EAST GERMANY INTO CZECHOSLOVAKIA OVERSHADOWS ALL OTHER DEVELOPMENTS IN THE WORLD'S NEWS TODAY.

WORD OF THE CROSSING OF THE BORDER BROADCAST BY RADIO PRAGUE WITH APPEALS TO THE PEOPLE TO REMAIN CALM AND OFFER NO RPT NO RESISTANCE, SENT AN IMMEDIATE SHOCK WAVE OF REACTION AROUND THE WORLD.

PRESIDENT JOHNSON SUMMONED THE NATIONAL SECURITY COUNCIL TO MEET BRITISH PRIME MINISTER HAROLD WILSON BROKE OFF A VACATION TO RETURN TO LONDON, AND OTHER WORLD LEADERS WERE KEEPING IN CLOSE TOUCH WITH THE SITUATION.

IN OTHER AREAS OF THE DAY'S ACTIVITIES:

THE INTERNATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS IS TO CONTINUE IN BOGOTA, COLOMBIA, WITH FINAL PREPARATIONS BEING MADE TODAY FOR THE SCHEDULED ARRIVAL OF POPE PAUL TOMORROW.

THE SOCIALIST INTERNATIONAL TODAY OPENS A WORLD MEETING IN COPENHAGEN, WITH 100 LEADING SOCIAL DEMOCRATS FROM 51 COUNTRIES SCHEDULED TO BE ON HAND.

VISITING YUGOSLAV PREMIER MIKA SPILJAK TODAY IS TO CONTINUE TOURING NORTHERN NORWAY AS PART OF HIS FIVE-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO THAT COUNTRY.

THE MASTER OF A SOVIET FISHING TRAWLER CHARGED WITH ENTERING BRITISH TERRITORIAL WATERS IS TO GO ON TRIAL IN LERWICK, SCOTLAND, TODAY.
