NOON

THE HAGUE: HOLLAND'S LARGEST POLITICAL PARTY, THE ROMAN CATHOLIC PEOPLE'S PARTY TO WHICH PRIME MINISTER PIET DE JONG BELONGS, ISSUED A STATEMENT SAYING IT WAS PROFOUNDLY SHOCKED AND INDIGNANT ABOUT THE "CRUEL INTERVENTION." THE DUTCH CABINET WENT INTO SPECIAL SESSION, AND THE DUTCH COMMUNIST PARTY HELD SECRET CONSULTATIONS.

ATHENS: THE GREEK GOVERNMENT SAID THAT WITH THE INVASION THE WORLD NOW KNEW WHO WERE THE REAL ADVOCATES OF "IMPERIALISM, COLONIALISM AND AGGRESSION."

IN GENEVA, THE INTERNATIONAL COMMISSION OF JURISTS CONDEMNED THE ACTION AS A CLEAR AND INDEFENSIBLE VIOLATION OF THE U.N. CHARTER, WHILE IN PARIS THE PRESIDENT OF THE FRENCH LEAGUE OF HUMAN RIGHTS, DANIEL MAYER, EXPRESSED "INDIGNATION, WORRY AND ANXIETY."

OUTSIDE EUROPE, THERE HAVE BEEN OTHER EXPRESSIONS OF INDIGNATION.

IN JERUSALEM, THE HEAD OF THE ISRAELI COMMUNIST PARTY, MOSHE SNEH, SAID THE INVASION WAS A

"BLACK DAY IN THE HISTORY OF THE COMMUNIST MOVEMENT."

IT WAS THE END OF COMMUNIST SOLIDARITY.

IN KENYA, THE FOREIGN MINISTER, CLEM ARGWINGS-KODHEK, SAID: "WE CONDEMN ANY INVASION AND INFEERENCE FROM BIG POWERS TO SMALL POWERS." IN TANZANIA, LEADERS SAID THEY WERE SHOCKED BY THE UNEXPECTEDNESS OF THE NEWS.

IN CANBERRA, THE AUSTRALIAN PRIME MINISTER, JOHN GORTON, SAID HE DEPLORED COMPLETELY AND UTTERLY THE INVASION.
