C/S -- CETEKA REPORTS ON PRAGUE SHOOTING

MUNICH, AUG 21 (CMD/CETEK) -- CETEKA NEWS AGENCY TODAY DESCRIBED THE DRAMA OF PRAGUE AND BRATISLAVA UNDER SOVIET OCCUPATION.

A CETEKA REPORTER RECOUNTED WALKING THROUGH THE CENTER OF PRAGUE AT ABOUT 1100 MT WHEN GUNFIRE WAS HEARD.

SOME WINDOWS OF THE PRAGUE RADIO BUILDING HAD BEEN SHOT OUT. THE NATIONAL MUSEUM DIRECTLY IN THE CENTER OF THE CITY ALSO SHOWED MARKS OF SHOTS FIRED BY AUTOMATIC WEAPONS.

AT LEAST 10 AMBULANCES HAD BEEN CALLED TO THE RADIO BUILDING AFTER THE SHOOTING.

THEN SHORTLY BEFORE 11:30 MT CETEKA REPORTED, MORE SHOOTING OCCURRED IN PRAGUE.

SOVIET TROOPS OPENED FIRE WITH SMALL ARMS FOR A PERIOD OF ABOUT FIVE MINUTES, CETEKA REPORTED.

THE AGENCY SAID 20 PERSONS WERE TAKEN TO THE VINOHRADY HOSPITAL IN PRAGUE, MOSTLY SUFFERING FROM BULLET WOUNDS. OTHERS HAD CRUSHED LEGS AFTER BEING RUN OVER BY TANKS.

A SOVIET TANK RAN OVER ZDENEK PRIHODA, A 27-YEAR-OLD MOTORCYCLIST, CETEKA REPORTED, AND PRIHODA LATER DIED OF HIS WOUNDS, CETEKA SAID.

DR. DR. VLADIMIR KORCAK SAID NONE OF THE PEOPLE ADMITTED WERE IN A DANGEROUS CONDITION, THE AGENCY SAID.
