BUT, THE CETEKA REPORT WENT ON TO SAY, THE DELEGATION HAD "REACHED AN AGREEMENT WITH EMBASSY STAFF THAT IT WILL BE RECEIVED TOMORROW, THURSDAY, AT 1000 MT."

THE DELEGATION HAD INSISTED ON SEEING AMBASSADOR CERVONENKO, "OR EVEN THE COMMANDER OF THE OCCUPATION UNITS,"

(CMD-- THE CETEKA REPORT DOES NOT CLARIFY WHY THE MIKOVA DELEGATION HAD ALSO GONE TO THE SOVIET EMBASSY.)

THE DELEGATION TO MEET AT THE SOVIET EMBASSY TOMORROW MORNING WAS "AGAIN CHARGED" BY THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY WITH EMPHATICALLY "DEMANDING FULFILLMENT OF ALL SIX POINTS OF ITS RESOLUTION ADOPTED AT THIS AFTER-NOON'S SESSION OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY."

THESE DEMANDS CALL FOR THE "IMMEDIATE WITHDRAWAL" OF THE FOREIGN OCCUPATION FORCES, THE "IMMEDIATE CREATION" OF CONDITIONS FOR THE LEGAL ACTIVITY OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT, THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY AND THE PRESIDUM OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY, "THE RELEASE " OF ALL CONSTITUTIONAL OFFICIALS, "WHO HAVE ^{BEEN} PREVENTED FROM ACTIVITY AND FROM THE EXECUTION OF THEIR DUTIES," "THE IMMEDIATE NOMINATION OF THE OFFICIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE OCCUPATION COUNTRIES WHO WOULD BE AVAILABLE FOR NEGOTIATION WITH THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY,"

AT ITS AFTERNOON SESSION, THE ASSEMBLY HAD ALSO "RESERVED THE RIGHT TO DISCUSS EXCEPTIONAL MEASURES," THE CETEKA REPORT SAID.
