X/4 - EURO - SPILJAK CONDEMNS INTERFERENCE IN C/S

MUNICH, AUG 22 (CMD) -- YUGOSLVA PREMIER MIKA SPILJAK TOLD A PRESS CONFERENCE IN OSLO, NORWAY, YESTERDAY, THAT THE SOVIET INTERVENTION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA WOULD HAVE "BAD CONSEQUENCES", RADIO BELGRADE REPORTED.

ANSWERING QUESTIONS ON THE CZECHOSLOVAK EVENTS, SPILJAK SAID THAT THIS WAS A VERY UNPLEASANT AFFAIR WHICH WILL CERTAINLY HAVE BAD CONSEQUENCES FOR THE FURTHER DEVELOPMENT OF INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS, THE RADIO SAID.

THE RADIO QUOTES SPILJAK AS SAYING THAT INTERFERENCE INTO THE DOMESTIC AFFAIRS OF OTHER COUNTRIES CERTAINLY COULD NOT RPT NOT BE WELCOMED.

HE SAID FURTHER THAT YUGOSLAVIA WILL ADOPT A NEGATIVE ATTITUDE REGARDING ANY INTERFERENCE INTO THE DOMESTIC AFFAIRS OF OTHER COUNTRIES. (RADIO BELGRADE, DOMESTIC/M, AUGUST 21, 1968, 2200)
