THE COUNCIL WAS SUMMONED INTO URGENT SESSION AT THE DEMAND OF THE UNITED STATES, BRITAIN, CANADA, FRANCE, DENMARK AND PARAGUAY.

CANADIAN AMBASSADOR GEORGE IGNATIEFF BROUGHT UP A RESOLUTION PUSHED THROUGH THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY BY THE SOVIET UNION TWO YEARS AGO WHICH SAYS "NO STATE HAS THE RIGHT TO INTERVENE, DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY, FOR ANY REASON WHATEVER, IN THE INTERNAL OR EXTERNAL AFFAIRS OF ANY OTHER STATE."

MOSCOW'S INTERVENTION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, IGNATIEFF SAID, "BRUTALLY NEGATES THE RIGHT OF A STATE TO TAKE THOSE STEPS WHICH IT CONSIDERS TO BE IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF ITSELF AND OF THE ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT OF ITS PEOPLE."

"IT IS A BLOW TO THE SELF-RESPECT AND DIGNITY OF ALL (U.S.) MEMBER STATES," IGNATIEFF SAID.

"THE SITUATION THE WORLD FACES TONIGHT IS AN AFFRONT TO ALL CIVILIZED SENSIBILITIES," BALL SAID.

"THE ONLY IMPERIALIST REACTION WE HAVE TO CONSIDER TONIGHT IS RUSSIAN," LORD CARADON, BRITISH MINISTER OF STATE, SAID.

"IT IS CLEARLY A MATTER WHICH IS INTERNATIONAL IN CHARACTER," SAID SKJOLD G. MELLBIN, ACTING CHIEF OF DENMARK'S DELEGATION.
