

WORLD - THE DAY AHEAD

MUNICH, AUG 22 (CNR) -- THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY TROOPS OF THE SOVIET UNION AND FOUR OTHER WARSAW PACT COUNTRIES CONTINUES TO DOMINATE THE NEWS OF THE WORLD TODAY.

WITH SOVIET, POLISH, EAST GERMAN, BULGARIAN AND HUNGARIAN TROOPS APPARENTLY IN FULL CONTROL OF THE COUNTRY, AND THE WHEREABOUTS OF TOP CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS UNKNOWN, THE COURSE OF DEVELOPMENTS WAS AWAITED.

THE COMMUNIST PARTY LEADERS OF RUMANIA AND YUGOSLAVIA HAD JOINED WESTERN COMMUNIST PARTIES AND WESTERN GOVERNMENT LEADERS IN CONDEMNING THE INVASION, AND YOUNG PEOPLE HAD DEMONSTRATED THROUGHOUT THE WEST AGAINST THE OCCUPATION.

THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL IS SCHEDULED TO MEET TODAY (1530 MT) TO CONTINUE DEBATE ON THE CZECHOSLOVAK SITUATION, AFTER THE COUNCIL OVERRODE A SOVIET ATTEMPT TO KEEP THE MATTER OFF THE AGENDA, AND CZECHOSLOVAKIA FORMALLY PROTESTED TO THE COUNCIL AGAINST THE INVASION.

THE RUMANIAN NATIONAL ASSEMBLY HAS BEEN CALLED TO MEET TODAY BECAUSE OF THE SITUATION, WHICH WILL ALSO BRING THE BRITISH CABINET TOGETHER.

AFTER MAKING A STATEMENT EXPRESSING DISMAY AT THE DEVELOPMENTS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, POPE PAUL TRAVELS TODAY TO BOGOTA, COLUMBIA, TO ATTEND THE INTERNATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS.

NEW CONCERN OVER THE STATUS OF THE VIETNAM WAR IS OCCASIONED TODAY BY A SHARP ROCKET ATTACK ON SAIGON.

IN THE U.S., THE CONDITION OF FORMER PRESIDENT EISENHOWER CONTINUES TODAY A MATTER OF DEEP CONCERN.
