BBC BROADCASTS TO RUSSIA, BULGARIA JAMMED

LONDON, AUGUST 22-(RFE SPECIAL/HOOD)--THE BRITISH BROADCASTING CORPORATION SAID TODAY THAT THEIR BROADCASTS TO RUSSIA AND BULGARIA ARE STILL BEING JAMMED.

THEIR BROADCASTS TO CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND OTHER COMMUNIST-CONTROLLED COUNTRIES ARE NOT RPT NOT BEING JAMMED, AS FAR AS BBC ENGINEERS ARE ABLE TO DETERMINE, A SPOKESMAN SAID.

THE JAMMING OF BROADCASTS TO RUSSIA AND BULGARIA BEGAN AT MIDDAY YESTERDAY, FOLLOWING THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY RUSSIAN AND OTHER WARSAW PACT TROOPS.

FOR SOME REASON THE EVENING BULLETIN TO BULGARIA WAS NOT RPT NOT JAMMED YESTERDAY BUT THE INTERFERENCE WAS RESUMED THIS MORNING.

JAMMING OF BBC BROADCASTS TO RUSSIA CEASED AT THE BEGINNING OF JUNE 1963 AND JAMMING OF THOSE TO BULGARIA AT THE END OF MAY 1964.

DEBRE TO ADDRESS PARLIAMENTARY GROUP ON PRAGUE

PARIS AUG. 22 (RFE SPECIAL/OVADIA) --- FRENCH FOREIGN MINISTER MICHEL DEBRE WILL ADDRESS THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLYS FOREIGN AFFAIRS COMMISSION ABOUT THE EVENTS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, IT WAS ANNOUNCED IN PARIS THURSDAY.

THE PRESIDENT OF THE FOREIGN AFFAIRS COMMISSION, JACQUES VENDROUX, GAULLIST, YESTERDAY DEMANDED A SPECIAL MEETING BE CALLED WITH THE FOREIGN MINISTER ABOUT CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE MEETING HAS BEEN SCHEDULED FOR NEXT THURSDAY MORNING.

BRITISH MINISTER CALLS IT "TRAGIC DISAPPOINTMENT"

LONDON, AUGUST 22--(RFE SPECIAL/HOOD)--BRITISH DEFENCE SECRETARY DENIS HEALEY, WHO FLEW HOME FROM SWITZERLAND LAST NIGHT FOR TODAY'S CABINET MEETING ON THE RUSSIAN INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA, SAID ON ARRIVAL AT LONDON AIRPORT:

"THIS IS A TRAGIC DISAPPOINTMENT FOR EVERYONE WHO HOPED TO SEE A CLOSER RELATIONSHIP WITH THE EAST."

NEWSPAPER FOR CZECHOSLOVAK STUDENTS IN ENGLAND

LONDON, AUGUST 22--(RFE SPECIAL/HOOD)--A SPOKESMAN FOR BUTLIN HOLIDAY CAMPS SAID TODAY THAT A DAILY NEWSPAPER IN CZECH IS TO BE PRODUCED BECAUSE OF THE LARGE NUMBER OF CZECHOSLOVAK STUDENTS WORKING FOR THEM THIS SUMMER.

A DAILY MESSAGE FROM THE CZECHOSLOVAK EMBASSY IN LONDON WILL ALSO BE PLAYED TO THEM EACH EVENING.

"IT IS HOPED BY THESE MEANS TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WHOSE ENGLISH IS NOT GOOD WITH AN ACCURATE AND UP TO DATE ACCOUNT OF WHAT IS HAPPENING IN THEIR COUNTRY," HE EXPLAINED.

THE BRITISH NATIONAL UNION OF STUDENTS SAID TODAY THERE ARE ABOUT 1,000 CZECHOSLOVAK STUDENTS IN ENGLAND TH/S SUMMER. THE MAJORITY ARE WORKING AT HOLIDAY CAMPS.

"MANY OF THEM MAY HAVE TO PROLONG THEIR STAY IN BRITAIN, AND WE ARE INVESTIGATING WAYS IN WHICH THEY CAN BE ASSISTED WITH THEIR PROBLEMS," A SPOKESMAN FOR THE NUS SAID.
