

MUNICH, AUG 23 (CNR/AGENCIES)-- EUROPE, AFRICA, ASIA AND THE AMERICAS THURSDAY SAW DEMONSTRATIONS AND STATEMENTS OF PROTEST AGAINST THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

A ROUNDUP OF THE DEMONSTRATION SCENES SHOWED:

LONDON:

IN LONDON, MORE THAN 1,000 DEMONSTRATORS CHANTING "DUBCEK, DUBCEK" MARCHED TO NUMBER 10 DOWNING STREET TONIGHT WITH A PETITION ASKING PRIME MINISTER HAROLD WILSON TO CALL FOR U.N. INTERVENTION.

ROME:

CZECHOSLOVAK TOURISTS AND ABOUT 500 ITALIAN YOUTHS ARMED WITH STICKS CLASHED WITH STRONG POLICE GUARDS PROTECTING THE SOVIET EMBASSY.

FOR OVER AN HOUR THE DEMONSTRATORS REPEATEDLY TRIED TO BREAK THROUGH THE POLICE CORDONS SEALING OFF THE STREETS AROUND THE EMBASSY BUILDING, EYEWITNESSES SAID.

FIRST REPORTS SAID TWO POLICEMEN AND TWO DEMONSTRATORS WERE INJURED AND ANOTHER TWO DEMONSTRATORS DETAINED.

DEMONSTRATORS LATER MARCHED OFF TOWARDS THE HEADQUARTERS OF THE ITALIAN COMMUNIST PARTY, SCUFFLING WITH POLICE OUTSIDE THE OFFICES OF THE SOVIET-ITALIAN FRIENDSHIP SOCIETY ON THE WAY.

ABOUT 40 PRO-CHINESE STUDENTS STAGED A SIT-IN STRIKE IN THE ARTS FACULTY OF GENOA UNIVERSITY PROTESTING AGAINST THE INVASION, AND IN VENICE, ABOUT 150 CZECHOSLOVAK, FRENCH, GERMAN AND ITALIAN STUDENTS MARCHED THROUGH ST. MARKS SQUARE CARRYING PLACARDS SUPPORTING MR. DUBCEK.

AT BARI PORT, IN SOUTHERN ITALY, A 32-YEAR-OLD CZECH SHIPS ENGINEER AND HIS WIFE AND BABY DAUGHTER ASKED FOR POLITICAL ASYLUM, THE SECOND CZECH SEAMAN TO DO SO THERE.

PARIS:

A CROWD HUNDREDS-STRONG, STAGED A PEACEFUL DEMONSTRATION OUTSIDE THE CZECHOSLOVAK EMBASSY LAST NIGHT.

SOME 100 YOUNG CZECHS WERE THERE, AND SOME OF THEM SCALED THE EMBASSY GATES AND SANG THEIR NATIONAL ANTHEM WHILE THE CROWD CHEERED.
