

VENEZUELA:

IN CARACAS, THE VENEZUELAN SENATE AND CHAMBER OF DEPUTIES WEDNESDAY NIGHT ADOPTED RESOLUTIONS CONDEMNING THE SOVIET INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

INDIA:

IN NEW DELHI: INDIAN PREMIER MRS INDIRA GANDHI TOLD PARLIAMENT INDIA WOULD UPHOLD THE RIGHTS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA UNDER THE UNITED NATIONS CHARTER. SHE EXPRESSED CONCERN FOR THE SAFETY OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT AND URGED WITHDRAWAL OF SOVIET TROOPS.

DURING THE FOUR-HOUR DEBATE ON THE CRISIS THE OPPOSITION PARTY DEMANDED THAT THE PREMIER SHOULD OPENLY CONDEMN SOVIET AGGRESSION. BUT MRS GANDHI REFUSED TO DO THIS.

ELSEWHERE:

IN REYKJAVIK, ICELAND, DEMONSTRATORS SMASHED THE WINDOWS OF THE SOVIET EMBASSY.

IN NICOSIA, THE CAPITAL OF THE MEDITERRANEAN ISLAND OF CYPRUS, GREEK CYPRIOT WORKERS SHOUTING "MURDERERS, BARBARIANS" BROKE THROUGH POLICE CORDONS AROUND THE SOVIET EMBASSY, SMASHED SHOWCASES DISPLAYING RUSSIAN PROPAGANDA PICTURES AND RIPPED A BRASS PLATE FROM THE FRONT OF THE BUILDING. POLICE CLASHED WITH THE DEMONSTRATORS.

IN TOKYO, A CROWD OF MILITANT ZENGAKUREN STUDENTS TRIED TO BREAK INTO THE SOVIET EMBASSY AND THREE WERE ARRESTED.

IN LUSAKA, ZAMBIA, ZAMBIAN FOREIGN MINISTER REUBEN KAMANGA READ A STATEMENT FROM PRESIDENT KAUNDA TO PARLIAMENT IN WHICH HE SAID "IT WAS UNTHINKABLE THAT RUSSIA, WHO DID NOT FAIL TO CONDEMN COLONIALIST AND IMPERIALIST ACTS OF AGGRESSION, SHOULD FIND HERSELF COMMITTING THIS MONSTROUS ACT FULL OF DIRE CONSEQUENCES TO HUMANITY.

PRESIDENT KAUNDA CONDEMNED THE RUSSIAN INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA AS "AN IMPERIALISTIC ACT OF NAKED AGGRESSION." HE ASSURED THE CZECH PEOPLE THEY HAD THE MORAL AND SPIRITUAL SUPPORT OF ZAMBIA.

IN DAR-ES-SALAAM, TANZANIA, THE TANZANIAN GOVERNMENT TODAY ANNOUNCED POSTPONEMENT OF A PLANNED GOODWILL VISIT TO YUGOSLAVIA AND BULGARIA NEXT WEEK BY VICE PRESIDENT RASHIDI KAWAWA. NO REASON WAS GIVEN.

IN CALCUTTA, INDIA, MEMBERS OF THE PRAJA SOCIALIST PARTY, WAVING ANTI-SOVIET POSTERS AND SHOUTING ANTI-SOVIET SLOGANS, MARCHED ON THE SOVIET CONSULATE TO DELIVER A MEMORANDUM PROTESTING THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA. POLICE KEPT THEM AWAY FROM THE CONSULATE. THE RUSSIANS REFUSED TO RECEIVE THE MEMORANDUM.

IN TEL AVIV, ISRAEL, THE ISRAELI CABINET EXPRESSED SHOCK THAT THE SANCTIFIED PRINCIPLES OF POLITICAL INDEPENDENCE, TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY, PEACE CO-EXISTENCE AND NON-INTERVENTION IN THE INTERNAL AFFAIRS OF A STATE HAD BEEN VIOLATED. IT SAID THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA WAS AN OUTRAGEOUS VIOLATION OF THE UNITED NATIONS CHARTER.
