C/S -- FOURTH ADD PROTESTS (CN 25) XXX CZECHOSLOVAKIA

FROM KATHMANDU, THE NEPALESE GOVERNMENT SAID IT VIEWED THE INVASION WITH "GRAVE CONCERN AND DISSATISFACTION" AND SAID: "THERE IS NO EVIDENCE OF REAL DANGER TO SOCIALIST COUNTRIES FROM EXTERNAL ANTI-SOCIALIST ELEMENTS."

THE TUNISIAN GOVERNMENT SAID IT HAD LEARNED "WITH CONSTERNATION OF THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY THE FORCES OF SOCIALIST BROTHERS" AND EXPRESSED ITS "REVULSION" AT THE ACTION.

THE BURMESE GOVERNMENT ALSO URGED WITHDRAWAL OF THE OCCUPATION TROOPS.

IN SANTIAGO, WINDOWS AT THE RUSSIAN EMBASSY WERE SMASHED WHEN LEFTIST STUDENTS CLASHED WITH CATHOLIC STUDENTS IN FRONT OF THE BUILDING.

IN THE HAGUE, MEMBERS OF THE HAGUES PHILHARMONIC ORCHESTRA TOLD ORGANISERS OF A FESTIVAL FOR MODERN MUSIC IN WARSAW NEXT MONTH THAT THEY WOULD NOT TAKE PART BECAUSE OF THE INVASION.
