

WORLD -- MORNING INTRO -- SOCIALIST INTERNATIONAL

COPENHAGEN, AUG 23 (UPI)-- THE SOCIALIST INTERNATIONAL THURSDAY ENDED ITS TWO DAY CONFERENCE IN COPENHAGEN A DAY EARLY AFTER CON-DEMNING THE SOVIET INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE CONFERENCE ENDED EARLY BUT MANAGED TO PASS A NUMBER OF RESOLUTIONS ON PROBLEMS AROUND THE WORLD BEFORE ADJOURNING.

THE RESOLUTIONS INCLUDED:

--CALLING ON THE UNITED STATES TO CEASE BOMBING OF NORTH VIETNAM AS A CONDITION FOR A CEASEFIRE AND PEACE TALKS.

--CALLING FOR AN END TO THE SUPPLY OF ARMS AND AID TO THE PRESENT GREEK REGIME AND A SUSPENSION OF THE ASSOCIATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN GREECE AND THE COMMON MARKET. THEY ALSO CONDEMNED THE PROJECTED REFERENDUM ON A NEW GREEK CONSTITUTION.

--ASKING FOR AN INTERNATIONAL EMBARGO ON ARMS SHIPMENTS TO BOTH SIDES IN THE NIGERIAN CIVIL WAR AND CALLING FOR AN EARLY SETTLEMENT.

--RE-AFFIRMED REJECTION OF SOUTH AFRICAN APARTHEID, A TIGHTENING UP OF SANCTIONS ON RHODESIA, AND REJECTING ANY RHODESIAN INDEPENDENCE UNTIL MAJORITY AFRICAN RULE.

--CALLED FOR A DIRECTLY NEGOTIATED PEACE SETTLEMENT IN THE MIDDLE EAST.

--URGED A STUDY OF YOUTH REVOLT.

AMONG THE SPEAKERS WHO ADDRESSED THE CONFERENCE WERE EXILED GREEK POLITICAN ANDREAS PAPANDREOU WHO DENOUNCED THE PRESENT GREEK REGIME, AND FORMER BRITISH FOREIGN SECRETARY GEORGE BROWN, WHO DEFENDED BRITAIN'S RIGHT TO GIVE NIGERIA ARMS AS A COMMONWEALTH MEMBER AND SAID AN ARMS EMBARGO WOULD NOT BE SUCCESSFUL.
