

CS - 3RD ADD U.S., SOVIET DELEGATES ARGUE (CN 63) X X X ADDED.

(UPI) - "TONIGHT WE KNOW," HE SAID, "THAT THE SOVIET UNION IS TRYING FORCE MAJEUR TO CREATE A NEW GOVERNMENT IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA. THERE IS LITTLE DOUBT THAT IT WILL, AT LEAST ON PAPER, AT LEAST ON THE SURFACE, ACHIEVE ITS PURPOSE."

HE SAID THE RUSSIANS "ARE OBVIOUSLY HOPING THIS BODY WILL DELAY ITS ACTION LONG ENOUGH FOR A SYNTHETIC GOVERNMENT TO SEND ITS REPRESENTATIVES."

SOVIET AMBASSADOR JACOB A. MALIK THREATENED AN ALL-NIGHT FILIBUSTER, IF NECESSARY.

"I AM READY TO SIT HERE ALL NIGHT," HE SAID.

"THE MEETING WILL BE A SORT OF A NIGHT VIGIL. IT WILL LAST A FEW MORE HOURS, IF THEY KEEP INSISTING."

THIS WAS A REFERENCE TO WESTERN DELEGATIONS WHICH WERE OBJECTING TO SOVIET-BLOC PROPOSALS TO ADJOURN THE MEETING AND PERMIT THE AMBASSADOR OF BULGARIA TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL THE FOLLOWING MORNING.

BALL REFERRED TO A DRAFT RESOLUTION INTRODUCED EARLIER THURSDAY BY THE WESTERN NATIONS. "I THINK THE TIME HAS COME WHEN WE HAVE TO FACE REALITY, OUR OWN CONSCIENCES, OUR OWN REPONSIBILITIES," HE SAID. "I PROPOSE WE PUT TO A VOTE THE RESOLUTION WHICH IS BEFORE THIS BODY. I AM CONFIDENT ABOUT WHAT THE OUTCOME OF THE VOTE WILL BE."

BALL URGED A VOTE ON THE DRAFT RESOLUTION AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

THE RESOLUTION, SPONSORED BY THE U.S., BRITAIN, CANADA, DENMARK, FRANCE, PARAGUAY, BRAZIL AND THE AFRICAN STATE OF SENEGAL, WOULD CONDEMN THE "ARMED INTERVENTION" OF THE SOVIET BLOC COUNTRIES IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND DEMAND THE WITHDRAWAL OF THEIR TROOPS FORTHWITH.
