X/4 C/S -- PRAGUE INTERVIEWS ASSEMBLY MEMBERS

MUNICH, AUG 23 (CMD) -- RADIO PRAGUE TODAY INTERVIEWED BY TELEPHONE TWO MEMBERS OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK NATIONAL ASSEMBLY WHO ARE ATTENDING AN ASSEMBLY SESSION WHICH STARTED ON WEDNESDAY.

MEMBER OF THE PRESIDUM OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, JIRI LACINA, TOLD RADIO PRAGUE: "THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, ALL MEMBERS OF THE ASSEMBLY WHO GATHERED IN THE ASSEMBLY BUILDING, IN THE TEMPORARY NATIONAL ASSEMBLY BUILDING, ARE DETERMINED TO CONTINUE THEIR DISCUSSIONS UNDER ALL CIRCUMSTANCES. OUR WORK CAN BE STOPPED ONLY BY A VIOLENT MEASURE. WE MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO MAINTAIN UNINTERRUPTED CONTACT WITH THE PRESIDENT AND WITH THE FREE MEMBERS OF THE GOVERNMENT OF ENGINEER CERNIK. WE MAKE ALL EFFORTS TO MAINTAIN CONTACTS WITH ALL PEOPLE.

"WITH THIS UNITED COURSE WE WANT TO CONVINCE NOT RPT NOT ONLY OUR BUT ALSO THE FOREIGN PUBLIC, BUT ABOVE ALL THE OCCUPATION UNITS, AND THE OCCUPATION ADMINISTRATION TO LEAVE OUR TERRITORY," LACINA ADDED.

ASKED TO DESCRIBE WHAT IS CONSIDERED AS MOST IMPORTANT IN THIS "TENSE SITUATION", ACADEMICIAN AND ASSEMBLY MEMBER IVAN MALEK SAID:

"THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY CONTINUES TO CONSIDER IT AS MOST IMPORTANT TO MAINTAIN UNITY WHICH WAS CREATED IN THAT SITUATION, TO MAINTAIN UNITY OF VIEWS..."
