

(RFE SPECIAL ENDRST)- THE TEXT OF THE CANADIAN DRAFT RESOLUTION IS SHORT. IT SAYS: "THE SECURITY COUNCIL, CONCERNED AT REPORTS ABOUT THE CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, INCLUDING THE ARREST OF CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS.

"REQUESTS THE SECRETARY GENERAL TO APPOINT AND DISPATCH IMMEDIATELY TO PRAGUE A SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE WHO SHALL SEEK THE RELEASE AND ENSURE THE PERSONAL SAFETY OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS UNDER DETENTION AND WHO SHALL REPORT BACK URGENTLY."

THE ALGERIAN DELEGATE AGREED AND DEPLORED THE FACT THAT CZECHOSLOVAK SOVEREIGNTY HAD BEEN VIOLATED BY THE UNAUTHORIZED ENTRY OF FOREIGN TROOPS ON ITS TERRITORY. BUT HE ALSO DEcriED WHAT HE CALLED PAST TOLERANCE OF THE COUNCIL OF SIMILAR VIOLATIONS IN VIETNAM AND THE MIDDLE EAST. HE EVEN SUGGESTED THAT THE SITUATION IN THOSE TWO PARTS OF THE WORLD "HAVE PLAYED A DETERMINING ROLE" IN THE EVENTS OF CENTRAL EUROPE.

INDIA JOINED WITH OTHERS IN ASKING FOR AN IMMEDIATE WITHDRAWAL OF FOREIGN TROOPS FROM CZECHOSLOVAKIA. ITS DELEGATE SAID HE COULD HAVE VOTED FOR THE EIGHT POWER RESOLUTION (SENEGAL JOINED THE ORIGINAL SEVEN) HAD THE CO-SPONSORS AGREED TO TAKE OUT A PARAGRAPH CONDEMNING THE SOVIET UNION AND ITS ALLIES. INDIA ABSTAINED WITH PAKISTAN AND ALGERIA.

FRANCE, ALTHOUGH A CO-SPONSOR OF THE DEFEATED RESOLUTION, HAD LIMITED ITSELF TO ONE BRIEF INTERVENTION THROUGHOUT THE ENTIRE DEBATE.

(REUTER) SPONSORS OF THE RESOLUTION WITH CANADA WERE: THE U.S., BRITAIN, FRANCE, BRAZIL, PARAGUAY, DENMARK AND SENEGAL.

IN HIS REJOINDER TO MR. BALL, THE SOVIET DELEGATE SAID THE AMERICAN REMARKS WERE "FILLED WITH HATE." HE DEFENDED THE SOVIET USE OF THE VETO AS A PROTECTION AGAINST "IMPERIALIST DIVERSIONS AND SLANDERS" WHICH SERVED NOT ONLY SOVIET INTERESTS BUT THOSE OF OTHER PEOPLES.

HE SAID THAT THE "REPRESENTATIVES OF MONOPOLY CAPITAL" HAD ENGAGED IN SHAMELESS ACTIVITIES.

"IT IS YOU WHO ARE ENGAGED IN BLOODLETTING," HE SAID. "YOUR HANDS ARE COVERED WITH THE BLOOD OF IMPERIALIST TYRANNY --ATTEMPTING TO SUBJUGATE PEOPLES IN VIETNAM, THE MIDDLE EAST AND LATIN AMERICA."

(ENDRST)- BULGARIAN AMBASSADOR MILKO TARABANOV TOOK OVER FROM HIS SOVIET COLLEAGUE TO CONTINUE THE FILIBUSTER BEGUN BEFORE MIDNIGHT.

AT THE OUTSET OF HIS SPEECH, WHICH WITHOUT ANY APPARENT PREPARATION OR POLISHING WAS AVAILABLE IN FRONT OF HIM IN PRINT, TARABANOV ASSURED THE SECURITY COUNCIL THAT THOSE CHARGING SOVIET BLOC INTERVENTION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA WERE INDULGING IN PURE FANTASIES.

HE INSISTED THAT BULGARIA "WILL NEVER PRACTICE INTERVENTION IN OTHER COUNTRIES".

HIS COUNTRY WOULD NEVER ENGAGE IN TRYING TO CHANGE THE ESTABLISHED ORDER OF OTHERS, HE ADDED.

DELEGATES STARTED TO TROOP OUT OF THE COUNCIL CHAMBER TO THE ADJOINING CORRIDORS, BAR, AND COFFEE SHOP IN THE SECRETARIAT BUILDING, INSTEAD OF LISTENING TO THE MINUTE BUT APPARENTLY IRRELEVANT INFORMATION OFFERED BY THE BULGARIAN DELEGATE.

(REUTER)- MR. MALIK INDICATED THERE WOULD BE A BITTER QUARREL TODAY OVER MR. HAJEKS RIGHT TO ADDRESS THE COUNCIL AS CZECHOSLOVAK FOREIGN MINISTER.

MR. HAJEK WAS DUE IN NEW YORK EARLY THIS AFTERNOON -- BUT MR. MALIK ASKED WHOM HE WAS SUPPOSED TO REPRESENT.
