X/4 CURT - PRAGUE RADIO SAYS STRIKE OVER (RELEADS CN - 159)

MUNICH, AUG 23 (CMD) - RADIO FREE PRAGUE SAID TODAY THAT TODAY'S ONE-HOUR "PROTEST" STRIKE OF THE CZECH AND SLOVAK PEOPLE HAS ENDED.

THE RADIO SAID IT WAS A STRIKE "THROUGH WHICH WE UNEQUIVOCALLY EXPRESSED OUR VIEW."

"THE OCCUPIERS CANNOT RPT NOT SAY THAT THEY WILL FIND COLLABORATORS AMONG US," THE RADIO SAID.

THE RADIO SAID IN THE SAME BROADCAST THAT "SLOVAKIA IS REMAINING LOYAL TO ITS REPUBLIC."

ALL OVER SLOVAKIA, BLACK FLAGS WERE FLYING, AND CZECHOSLOVAK FLAGS WERE DOWN AT HALF MAST, THE BROADCAST SAID.

PETR DUBCEK, THE SON OF SOVIET-HELD CZECHOSLOVAK PARTY LEADER ALEXANDER DUBCEK, NOW ON VACATION IN EGYPT, SAID TODAY HE HAD NO RPT NO NEWS ABOUT HIS FATHER AND HIS OLDER BROTHER WHO IS NOW IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, THE RADIO SAID.

HE SAID "I HAVE NO RPT NO REASON TO REMAIN IN EXILE," THE RADIO QUOTED PETR DUBCEK AS SAYING. THE YOUNG DUBCEK SAID HE WOULD RETURN HOME ABOARD A CZECHOSLOVAK SHIP. (RADIO FREE PRAGUE/M, AUG 23, 1300).
