THE RADIO SAID THE TROOPS INSPECTED PASSENGER CARS AND SOUGHT PAPERS, LEAFLETS, TAPE RECORDERS AND CAMERAS.

THE RADIO ADVISED THE PEOPLE TO OBEY ORDERS BY THE TROOPS TO STOP.

THE RADIO ALSO SAID SOVIET TROOPS HAD BEEN MOVING FROM HUNGARY TO BRATISLAVA "DURING THE WHOLE NIGHT."

THE CONVOYS INCLUDED TANKS, ARMORED CARS, FIELD KITCHENS AND CARS LOADED WITH FUEL.

THE RADIO ALSO CALLED ON ITS LISTENERS TO STOP WORK AT NOON TODAY, BUT TO STAY AT WORKING PLACES AND MACHINES. IT SAID THE WORK SHOULD BE STOPPED "IN THE SPIRIT" OF THE SLOGAN "OCCUPIERS GO HOME."

THE RADIO SAID THE "PROTEST GENERAL STRIKE" WILL BEGIN AT 1200 O'CLOCK WITH THE SOUNDING OF SIRENS, KLAXONS AND BELLS, BUT DID NOT RPT NOT SAY HOW LONG IT SHOULD LAST.
