X/4 C/S - YUGOSLAVIA REPORTED AIDING CZECHOSLOVAKS THERE

MUNICH, AUG 23 (CMD) -- THE YUGOSLAV NEWS AGENCY TANJUG SAID TODAY THAT VARIOUS YUGOSLAV ENTERPRISES WERE MAKING EFFORTS TO HELP THE 50,000 CZECHOSLOVAKS VACATIONING IN YUGOSLAVIA WHEN THEIR COUNTRY WAS INVADED.

TANJUG SAID THAT SPECIAL BANK ACCOUNTS HAD BEEN OPENED IN MOST YUGOSLAV TOWNS TO WHICH ENTERPRISES AND INDIVIDUALS CAN MAKE CASH CONTRIBUTIONS FOR AID TO CZECHOSLOVAK TOURISTS.

THE COMMUNITY OF YUGOSLAV POSTAL, TELEGRAPH, AND TELEPHONE SERVICES HAS RECOMMENDED TO ALL POST OFFICES IN YUGOSLAVIA NOT RPT NOT TO CHARGE CZECHOSLOVAKS POSTAL FEES, ACCORDING TO TANJUG.

THE AGENCY SAID THAT MANY YUGOSLAV CATERING AND HOTEL ENTERPRISES HAD SET ASIDE PART OF THEIR ACCOMODATIONS FOR USE BY CZECHOSLOVAK TOURISTS ON A NO-CHARGE BASIS.
