X/13 W. GER - ANTI-SOVIET DEMONSTRATORS DETAINED IN COLOGNE

COLOGNE, 24 AUGUST (DPA/GND)- SOME DEMONSTRATORS, WHO TRIED TO STORM THE BUILDING OF THE SOVIET TRADE MISSION IN COLOGNE TONIGHT, WERE DETAINED BY POLICE AND RELEASED AFTER INTERROGATION IN POLICE HEADQUARTERS.

THE DEMONSTRATORS HAD PARTICIPATED IN A PROTEST RALLY IN COLOGNE AGAINST THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY WARSAW PACT TROOPS.

OTHER PROTEST RALLIES IN WEST GERMANY TOOK PLACE LAST NIGHT IN BREMEN WHERE THE CITY'S MAYOR ADDRESSED MORE THAN 6.000 PEOPLE AND CONDEMNED THE SOVIET MOVE.

IN STUTTGART MORE THAN 2.000 PEOPLE MARCHED THROUGH THE CITY'S DOWNTOWN SECTION WHILE OTHER PROTEST RALLIES WITH THOUSANDS OF DEMONSTRATORS TOOK PLACE IN KIEL AND OFFENBACH.

ALL WEST GERMAN STUDENTS ORGANISATIONS SIGNED A CABLE TODAY TO THE PRESIDUM OF THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF THE SOVIET PARTY DEMANDING "THE IMMEDIATE START OF NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE LEGAL LEADERSHIP OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK CP ON THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE SOVIET INTERVENTION TROOPS."

THE CABLE WAS SIGNED ALSO BY THE EXTREME LEFTWING GERMAN SOCIALIST STUDENTS UNION (SDS) AND THE SOCIAL DEMOCRATIC UNIVERSITY UNION.
