C/S -- 1ST ADD TALKS CONTINUE TODAY (CN 82) XXX LAW

THE FREE CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO SAID IT DID NOT RPT NOT KNOW HOW LONG THE MARTIAL LAW WOULD BE IN FORCE. THE RADIO CALLED ON PEOPLE TO STAY AT HOME OR AT WORK TO AVOID GIVING THE OCCUPATION FORCES REASONS FOR SHOOTING. IT SAID A CURFEW WOULD BE IN FORCE UNTIL 0500 MT.

MORE SECRET RADIOS WERE SEIZED BY THE SOVIETS ON FRIDAY BUT FOUR WERE STILL AUDIBLE IN MUNICH EARLY TODAY. THE SOVIETS CHARGED THAT THE CZECHOSLOVAKS WERE JAMMING COMMUNICATIONS BETWEEN SOVIET ARMY UNITS OF OCCUPATION.

ONE CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO BROADCAST SAID THAT THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY HAD ADJOURNED ITS 14TH EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS IN PROTEST AGAINST THE OCCUPATION. A TASS ANNOUNCEMENT CHARGED THAT THE HOLDING OF THE CONGRESS HAD BEEN IN VIOLATION OF CP RULES AND HAD BEEN CONVENED WITHOUT THE KNOWLEDGE OF THE PARTY'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE.

A CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO CALLING ITSELF FREE SLOVAK TRANSMITTER TWO SAID THAT THE EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS OF THE SLOVAK C.P. DANUBE/ WOULD OPEN ON MONDAY AS SCHEDULED. THE RADIO SAID THIS WAS STATED BY THE PRESIDIUM OF THE SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY IN BRATISLAVA.

IN BELGRADE THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF THE YUGOSLAV CP PASSED A RESOLUTION CONDEMNING "THE AGGRESSION" CARRIED BY THE ARMED FORCES OF THE USSR, POLAND, EAST GERMANY, BULGARIA AND HUNGARY. THE ANNOUNCEMENT SAID THE TEXT OF THE YUGOSLAV RESOLUTION WOULD BE PUBLISHED TODAY.
