

CS - WESTERN GROUPS REACT WITH BOYCOTTS

MUNICH, AUG. 24 (CNR) - ORGANIZATIONS THROUGHOUT THE WORLD HAVE REACTED WITH BOYCOTTS OF EASTERN EUROPE TO THE WARSAW PACT OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE BOYCOTTS BEGAN WEDNESDAY, WHEN NEWS OF THE INVASION BECAME KNOWN, AND ACCELERATED THURSDAY AND FRIDAY.

WEDNESDAY:

WEST GERMANY'S CHEMICAL, PAPER AND CERAMIC UNIONS ANNOUNCED THAT IT WAS STOPPING IMMEDIATELY ALL CONTACTS WITH EASTERN EUROPE.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE DANISH FEDERAL YOUTH COUNCIL, WHICH REPRESENTS ALL POLITICAL YOUTH MOVEMENTS, CANCELED ITS ACCEPTANCE OF A SOVIET INVITATION TO SEND A DELEGATION TO THE SOVIET UNION NEXT MONTH.

DUTCH PREMIER PIET DE JONG ANNOUNCED AFTER A CABINET MEETING THAT A VISIT BY THE SOVIET NAVY TO AMSTERDAM NEXT MONTH WOULD BE CANCELED.

THE SWEDISH, NORWEGIAN AND DANISH TRACK AND FIELD ASSOCIATIONS ANNOUNCED THEIR WITHDRAWAL FROM THE EUROPEAN JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS SCHEDULED FOR LEIPZIG THIS WEEKEND.

THURSDAY:

THE DANISH AND NORWEGIAN GOVERNMENTS CANCELED THE OFFICIAL VISITS TO THEIR COUNTRIES PLANNED FOR NEXT MONTH BY BULGARIAN PREMIER TODOR ZHIVKOV.

SWEDEN'S ICE HOCKEY ASSOCIATION TOLD THE SOVIET CHAMPION, CSKA, NOT RPT NOT TO COME TO SWEDEN THIS WEEKEND FOR A SCHEDULED SERIES OF MATCHES. THE SWEDISH PENTATHLON ASSOCIATION CANCELED ITS PARTICIPATION IN BUDAPEST THIS WEEKEND.

A PRIVATE FRENCH ASSOCIATION FOR INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGES OF YOUTH SUSPENDED ALL CONTACTS WITH THE FIVE WARSAW PACT COUNTRIES THAT INVADDED CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

SCOTLAND'S FOOTBALL CHAMPIONS, THE GLASGOW CELTICS, SAID THEY DID NOT RPT NOT WANT TO PLAY FERENCVAROS IN BUDAPEST SEPT. 18.

THE LORD PROVOST OF GLASGOW TOLD THE POLISH CONSUL THAT WARSAW SHOULD CANCEL A TRADE FAIR SCHEDULED TO OPEN IN THE SCOTTISH CITY NEXT WEEK.

FRIDAY:

BRITISH FOREIGN SECRETARY MICHAEL STEWART CANCELED HIS SCHEDULED VISITS TO BULGARIA AND HUNGARY BUT SAID HE WOULD GO AHEAD WITH HIS VISIT TO RUMANIA NEXT MONTH.

WEST GERMANY'S METAL WORKERS UNION ANNOUNCED THAT IT HAD WITHDRAWN INVITATIONS TO SOVIET, POLISH, HUNGARIAN AND BULGARIAN UNIONS TO ATTEND ITS NINTH CONGRESS.

THE BRITISH UNION OF POST OFFICE WORKERS SAID IT HAD CANCELED THE VISIT OF ITS DELEGATION TO THE SOVIET COMMUNICATIONS WORKERS UNION.

BELGIUM CONFIRMED THAT IT HAD SUSPENDED CULTURAL EXCHANGE PROGRAMS WITH POLAND AND BULGARIA.

THE SUHRKAMP PUBLISHING HOUSE, WHICH PUBLISHED LEFT-WING AUTHORS AS WELL AS THE COLLECTED WORKS OF BERTOLD BRECHT, CANCELED ITS PARTICIPATION IN THE BOOK FAIR OF THE LEIPZIG AUTUMN FAIR.

THE DUTCH RESIDENCE ORCHESTRA CANCELED A CONCERT TRIP TO POLAND, SEVERAL POPULAR DUTCH SINGERS CANCELED PLANS TO ATTEND THE SOPOT MUSIC FESTIVAL AS WELL AS A TOUR OF THE SOVIET UNION THAT WOULD HAVE FOLLOWED AND DUTCH PARLIAMENTARIANS CANCELED A VISIT TO WARSAW.

THE SWEDISH ORGANIZERS OF THE WORLD SPEEDWAY CHAMPIONSHIPS PLANNED FOR SEPT. 6 SAID THEY WOULD TRY TO HAVE SOVIET AND POLISH DRIVERS EXCLUDED.

THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF SPORTS FISHERMEN IN ZURICH BARRED BULGARIA, EAST GERMANY AND HUNGARY FROM THE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIPS PLANNED FOR AUG. 26 TO SEPT. 1 IN LENZERHEIDE-VALBELLA.
