CS - 2ND ADD COUNCIL ARGUES (CN-215) XXX 1745 MT

(UPI)- MALIK PROTESTED THAT AN EAST GERMAN REQUEST TO SEND A REPRESENTATIVE HAD NOT EVEN BEEN CIRCULATED AS AN OFFICIAL COUNCIL DOCUMENT. COUNCIL PRESIDENT, JOAO AUGUSTO DE ARAUJO CASTRO, REPLIED THAT IT HAD BEEN SENT OUT FOR INFORMATION OF THE MEMBERS BUT NOT RPT NOT AS AN OFFICIAL DOCUMENT BECAUSE IT WAS RECEIVED LATE FRIDAY.

AMBASSADOR ARMAND BERAR OF FRANCE, LORD CARDON, BRITISH MINISTER OF STATE, AND U.S. AMBASSADOR GEORGE W. BALL ALL DECLARED THAT THEIR GOVERNMENTS DID NOT RECOGNIZE EAST GERMANY AS A STATE AND OPPOSED AN INVITATION TO IT TO SEND A REPRESENTATIVE HERE.

BALL SAID THE REQUEST TO BE HEARD WAS "ANOTHER MANEUVER" BY THE SOVIET UNION, SIMILAR TO MALIK'S "FILIBUSTER" IN EARLIER MEETINGS OF THE COUNCIL, TO DELAY ACTION.

DANISH AMBASSADOR OTTO R. BORCH SAID HIS DELEGATION ALSO OPPOSED AN INVITATION TO EAST GERMANY.

MALIK PROMPTLY LAUNCHED INTO ANOTHER LONG SPEECH, CHARGING THE UNITED STATES AND THE WESTERN POWERS WITH DELAYING COUNCIL ACTION.

"YOU MENTIONED THE WORD FILIBUSTER," MALIK SAID TO BALL. "IN RUSSIAN THAT WORD DOES NOT EXIST. RUSSIANS NEVER ENGAGE IN FILIBUSTERS. IT IS AN ANGLO-SAXON PRACTICE."
