

CS - FOURTH ADD - HAJEK (CN 250) XXX SAID

THESE FEELINGS, HE WARNED, "MAY DEGENERATE INTO FRUSTRATION AND INDIVIDUALISM WITH ALL THE CONSEQUENCES FOR A DIFFICULT SITUATION."

HAJEK SAID THAT THE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE CONSEQUENCES LAY WITH THOSE WHO HAD ORDERED THE OCCUPATION.

HE SAID THE INVASION HAD AFFECTED THE WORLD SITUATION," AND FOR THOSE CONSEQUENCES, IMMENSELY FATAL FOR THE POSSIBILITY OF WORLD PEACE," THE RESPONSIBILITY LAY WITH THE INVADERS.

HE SAID THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT WOULD NEVER ASSIST THE ENEMIES OF SOCIALISM.

"MY DELEGATION ABSOLUTELY DISSOCIATES ITSELF FROM ANY ATTEMPT TO DENIGRATE OR DENY THE EXISTENCE OF THE GERMAN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC...

"IT REMAINS ONE OF THE PRINCIPLES OF OUR FOREIGN POLICY THAT THE EXISTENCE OF TWO GERMAN STATES" IS BASIC TO WORLD SECURITY.

HE SAID THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT CONTINUED FIRMLY TO BELIEVE IN SOCIALISM AND THE PEOPLE HAD NO INTENTION OF LEAVING IT.

HAJEK PAID TRIBUTE TO THE ROLE OF THE SOVIET ARMIES IN THE LIBERATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

HE SAID THE PARTY HAD BEGUN TO BUILD ITS OWN ROAD "TO CREATE A SOCIAL AND POLITICAL MODEL CORRESPONDING TO OUR DEMOCRATIC TRADITIONS AND MENTALITIES."

HE SAID THE NATIONAL FEATURES OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK PEOPLE INFLUENCED THE THINKING OF ALL THE PROGRESSIVE STREAMS IN EUROPE IN THE PAST AND IN THE PRESENT.

THIS, HE SAID, HAD BEEN EXPRESSED VERY CLEARLY IN THE COUNTRY'S POLITICAL DEVELOPMENT SINCE JANUARY, "WHICH I WOULD LIKE TO STRESS ONCE MORE WAS NEVER INTENDED TO LEAVE THE SOCIALIST CONTACTS" WITH THE OTHER COUNTRIES.
