

CS - HUNGARIAN DELEGATE SPEAKS

MUNICH, AUG 24 (CNR)- THE HUNGARIAN DELEGATE TO THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL EARLIER TODAY SUPPORTED A SOVIET PROPOSAL THAT EAST GERMANY SHOULD BE INVITED TO ATTEND THE COUNCIL SESSIONS ON CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE HUNGARIAN SPOKE TWO AND A HALF HOURS AFTER THE COUNCIL LAUNCHED INTO A PROCEDURAL DEBATE ON THE ISSUE. MOST OF THIS TIME WAS TAKEN UP BY STATEMENTS BY SOVIET FOREIGN MINISTER JACOB MALIK.

THE HUNGARIAN DELEGATE OPPOSED ARGUMENTS BY THE UNITED STATES, BRITISH AND FRENCH DELEGATES THAT EAST GERMANY COULD NOT APPEAR BECAUSE IT WAS NOT A STATE.

HE SAID THIS WAS A DISCRIMINATION AGAINST THE GERMAN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC, FOR OTHER NON-MEMBER STATES HAD HAD DEALINGS WITH THE COUNCIL.

"TO AN EXTENT," HE SAID, "THE GERMAN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC IS A PARTY TO THE ISSUE."

HE SAID THIS SHOULD BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION AND A TELEGRAM FROM THE EAST GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER REQUESTING REPRESENTATION SHOULD BE CIRCULATED AS A COUNCIL DOCUMENT.

HE SAID IT WAS NOT FOR THE SECURITY COUNCIL TO DECIDE BY VOTING WHETHER EAST GERMANY WAS A STATE OR NOT.

"IT SEEMS TO ME THAT IN THE CASE OF A DOCUMENT COMING FROM THIS ECONOMIC-POLITICAL UNIT - THE GERMAN DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC - YOU (THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT) CAN ...DISTRIBUTE THIS (THE TELEGRAM) AS AN OFFICIAL DOCUMENT."

HE WENT ON TO SAY THAT "IF WE ARE TALKING ABOUT FILIBUSTERING," THEN THE FILIBUSTERING WAS STARTED BY THOSE WHO WERE TRYING TO PREVENT THE DOCUMENT FROM BEING DISTRIBUTED.
