C/S - MORNING INTRO - WESTERN REACTION

LONDON, AUG 25 (UPI)- THE WARSAW PACT INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA CONTINUED TO CAUSE CONSTERNATION TO GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS AROUND THE WORLD THIS WEEKEND.

THE TUNISIAN NATIONAL ASSEMBLY SATURDAY CONDEMNED THE SOVIETS SAYING THE INVASION WAS AN "ILLEGAL INTERFERENCE IN THE DOMESTIC AFFAIRS OF AN INDEPENDENT COUNTRY." THE ASSEMBLY VOICED ITS SUPPORT TO THE CZECHOSLOVAKS "IN THEIR FIGHT AND RESISTANCE AGAINST THE INVADERS."

ISRAELI AMBASSADOR TO THE UNITED STATES LT. GEN YITZHAK RABIN SPEAKING IN THE U.S. SAID THE OCCUPATION DEMONSTRATED THE WORLD NEEDS "A PEACE BASED UPON THE RIGHT OF SELF-DETERMINATION OF SMALL NATIONS."

RABIN SAID UNTIL THAT PEACE CAN BE ACHIEVED SMALL NATIONS MUST BE STRONG ENOUGH TO "WEAKEN THE AGGRESSOR'S TEMPTATION TO ATTACK THEM."

THE INTERNATIONAL LONGSHOREMEN'S ASSOCIATION SAID IN NEW YORK SATURDAY ITS MEMBERS WILL REFUSE TO HANDLE CARGO FROM EAST GERMANY, BULGARIA, HUNGARY AND POLAND BECAUSE OF THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE UNION NOTED IT HAS BEEN BOYCOTTING RUSSIAN CARGOES SINCE NOVEMBER, 1963.
