

WORLD - THE DAY AHEAD

MUNICH, AUG 25 (CNR)- THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA BY THE SOVIET UNION AND ITS WARSAW PACT SUPPORTERS STILL DOMINATES WORLD NEWS TODAY.

WHILE PROTESTS AND CONDEMNATIONS AGAINST THE INVASION CONTINUE, THE WORLD AWAITS THE RESULTS OF TALKS GOING ON IN MOSCOW BETWEEN SOVIET AND CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS.

CZECHOSLOVAK PRESIDENT LUDVIK SVOBODA WHO FLEW TO MOSCOW FRIDAY HAS BEEN REPORTED AS SAYING THAT THREE OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S MISSING LEADERS, INCLUDING PARTY CHIEF ALEXANDER DUBCEK, ARE TAKING PART IN THE TALKS.

DEVELOPMENTS ARE ALSO AWAITED FOLLOWING YESTERDAY'S MEETING BETWEEN RUMANIAN STATE AND PARTY LEADER NICOLAE CEAUSESCU AND PRESIDENT TITO OF YUGOSLAVIA. BOTH HAVE BEEN TARGETS FOR MOUNTING SOVIET ATTACKS BECAUSE OF THEIR SUPPORT OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S RECENT REFORMS.

THE UNITED NATIONS SECURITY COUNCIL WHICH YESTERDAY HEARD CZECHOSLOVAK FOREIGN MINISTER JIRI HAJEK APPEAL FOR THE REMOVAL OF OCCUPATION TROOPS FROM HIS COUNTRY, CONTINUES TO DEBATE THE CRISIS. MEXICO IS SEEKING TO MOVE THE ISSUE TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY WHERE THE SOVIETS HAVE NO RIGHT OF VETO.

CONCERN OF ANOTHER KIND IS FELT IN THE U.S. WHERE FORMER PRESIDENT DWIGHT D EISENHOWER IS STILL LISTED IN CRITICAL CONDITION AS HE FIGHTS ATTACKS OF HEART SPASMS.

POPE PAUL IS ON HIS WAY HOME AFTER HIS HISTORIC VISIT TO LATIN AMERICA AND HIS PLANE IS DUE TO ARRIVE IN ROME LATER TODAY.

COMMUNIST ATTACKS CONTINUE AT A HIGH RATE IN VIETNAM AS THE U.S. BATTLE TO AID ALLIED TROOPS BESEIGED BY THE VIET CONG AT THE DUC LAP CAMP NORTH OF SAIGON.

MEANWHILE, THE 29TH VENICE FILM FESTIVAL OPENS TODAY.
