"THE EVENTS, HOWEVER, HAVE TAKEN ANOTHER COURSE. THE RIGHT WING INCREASED ITS ACTIVITY, THE LEADERS COULD OR WOULD NOT MEET THE OBLIGATIONS THEY HAD ASSUMED IN BRATISLAVA AND, IN CONSEQUENCE OF THEIR WEAKNESS OR INCONSISTENCE, THE DANGER OF A BOURGEOIS RESTITUTION HAS TAKEN MORE AND MORE SHARP CONTOURS," MAGYAR NEMZET ADDED.

"THUS HAVE THE FIVE FRATERNAL COUNTRIES BEEN LED TO THE CONCLUSION THAT THE POLITICAL CHANCES OF A SETTLEMENT ARE EXHAUSTED AND THE MOMENT TO ACT HAS COME," IT SAID.

MTI ALSO REPORTED:

"MAGYAR HIRLAP REMINDS THAT WESTERN COMMENTARIES IN CONNECTION WITH THE CZECHOSLOVAK DEVELOPMENTS HAD TOUCHED LONG WEEKS, EVEN MONTHS AGO UPON THE POSSIBILITY THAT A 'NEW MINOR ENTENTE' MIGHT COME INTO BEING. IN THIS CONTEXT THE PAPER NOTES:

'TODAY THERE IS NO MINOR ENTENTE, WE ARE LIVING IN THE MIDST OF SOCIALIST NEIGHBOURS ... BUT, EVEN THOUGH TIMES HAVE CHANGED, SOCIALIST HUNGARY (THE HEIR OF ONE THOUSAND YEARS IN POINT OF NATIONAL INTERESTS) SHOULD NOT BE PLEASED TO SEE HERSELF SURROUNDED BY NEIGHBOURS DISTRUSTFUL TOWARDS THE SOVIET UNION.'

"IN CONCLUSION THE PAPER STATES: PUBLIC HUNGARIAN OPINION, HATING THE CRIMES AND DISTORTIONS OF DOGMATISM JUST AS MUCH AS EVERY PROGRESSIVE MINDED MAN OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA HATES THEM, IS TODAY A SUPPORTER OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA AS IT HAD STOOD IN JANUARY."
