

X/4 CS - PARLIAMENT PROTESTS SHOOTINGS, CAUTIONS CITIZENS

MUNICH, AUG 25 (CMD)- CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S PARLIAMENT TODAY PROTESTED SHOOTING IN PRAGUE BY OCCUPATION FORCES BUT ALSO WARNED CITIZENS TO SHOW MAXIMUM RESERVE DURING THE MOSCOW TALKS, RADIO FREE PRAGUE REPORTED.

IT SAID PARLIAMENT TOLD PEOPLE TO AVOID USELESS BLOODSHED AND LINKED RECENT SHOOTING TO A DISPLAY OF "UNSUITABLE POSTERS AND SLOGANS."

PARLIAMENT APPROVED THE ATTITUDE OF THE PRESIDIUM, "WHICH CARRIED OUT FURTHER FORMS OF COORDINATED CONTACTS OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC AND THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE OF THE COMMUNIST PARTY WITH THE CZECHOSLOVAK DELEGATION IN THE U.S.S.R. AND PRESIDENT LUDVIK SVOBODA AND WITH "COMRADES DUBCEK, CERNIK, SMARKOVSKY AND OTHERS."

THE RADIO SAID THE GOVERNMENT ALSO MET TODAY AND DISCUSSED THE NATIONAL ECONOMIC SITUATION.

IT SAID THAT THE GOVERNMENT WAS RECEIVING REPORTS THAT PEOPLE HAD WORKED "DUBCEK SHIFTS" IN NUMEROUS ENTERPRISES AND IN AGRICULTURE AND TRANSPORTATION THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY TO EASE THE "CONSEQUENCES OF THE OCCUPATION OF OUR COUNTRY BY FOREIGN ARMIES."
