

C/S - 2ND ADD SUPPORT. (CN 161) XXX CRISIS

ABOUT 10,000 PERSONS DEMONSTRATED IN MUNICH LAST NIGHT, CALLING FOR THE IMMEDIATE WITHDRAWAL OF WARSAW PACT TROOPS FROM CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

A MASS MEETING IN SUPPORT OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA WAS HELD IN STOCKHOLM LAST NIGHT, CONTINUING A SERIES OF DEMONSTRATIONS DEMANDED THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE TROOPS.

THE WORLD JEWISH CONGRESS SAID JEWS THROUGHOUT THE WORLD DEPLORED THE INVASION, AND A NATIONAL COMMITTEE WAS ESTABLISHED IN FRANCE TO COLLECT SIGNATURES SUPPORTING CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

CONGOLESE PRESIDENT JOSEPH MOBUTU TOLD THE SOVIET AMBASSADOR IN KINSHASA HIS COUNTRY COULD NOT RPT NOT "TOLERATE THE INVASION OR OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA IN THE MIDDLE OF THE 20TH CENTURY."

ABOUT 500 PERSONS TURNED OUT FOR A RALLY IN CHICAGO. THEY HEARD LOCAL POLITICIANS DENOUNCE THE WARSAW PACT OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

TORFINN BERNTZEN, PRESIDENT OF THE NORWEGIAN ATHLETICS COMMITTEE, SAID LAST NIGHT HE FAVORED WITHDRAWING NORWAY FROM THE OLYMPIC GAMES IN MEXICO CITY BECAUSE OF THE OCCUPATION.

YUGOSLAV ATHLETES WERE WITHDRAWN FROM THE EUROPEAN JUNIOR ATHLETICS CHAMPIONSHIPS IN LEIPZIG AS AN EXPRESSION OF SOLIDARITY WITH THE CZECHOSLOVAK PEOPLE.

DUKLA IGLAU, THE CZECHOSLOVAK ICE HOCKEY CHAMPIONS, HAVE POSTPONED THEIR RETURN TO CZECHOSLOVAKIA TO AWAIT THE OUTCOME OF THE MOSCOW TALKS, A SPOKESMAN IN LANDSHUT SAID.

TWO MORE MUSICIANS, CHARLES MUNCH AND JEAN MARTINEAU, ADDED THEIR NAMES TO A PARIS PETITION DRAWN UP BY LEADING MUSICIANS WHICH PROTESTED THE INVASION.

A GROUP OF BRITISH NEWSMEN YESTERDAY CABLED THE SOVIET WRITERS UNION IN MOSCOW URGING IT TO INTERCEDE WITH THE SOVIET GOVERNMENT ON BEHALF OF CZECHOSLOVAK JOURNALISTS.
