THE CHANCELLOR SAID EMPHATICALLY THAT THE FEDERAL  
REPUBLIC HAD NOT RPT NOT INTERFERED IN THE IDEOLOGICAL PROCESS IN  
CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

"I HAVE TRIED EVERYWHERE ALSO TP PREVENT THIS IMPRESSION ARISING  
FROM CLUMSY INTERVENTIONS, CLUMSY ATTEMPTS AT FAMILIARITIES, VISITS AND  
THE LIKE," HE SAID.

KIESINGER ADDED THAT MOSCOW COULD NOT HAVE OVERLOOKED THIS FACT.

HE DECLARED THAT IT WAS INCOMPREHENSIBLE THAT THE SOVIET UNION,  
THROUGH ITS INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA, HAD ACCEPTED "A MIGHTY RISK  
OF ISOLATION."

HE EXPRESSED HOPE THAT MOSCOW WOULD COME TO ITS SENSES AND  
TRY TO FIND A WAY OUT OF THIS SITUATION.
