C/S - BRITISH PARLIAMENT MEETS TODAY

LONDON, AUG. 26 (UPI/CNR)- THE BRITISH PARLIAMENT ASSEMBLES TODAY (1400 M.T.) FOR AN EMERGENCY SESSION TO DISCUSS CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

IT WILL BE PARLIAMENTS FIRST RECALL FROM SUMMER RECESS SINCE THE 1956 SUEZ CRISIS.

THE LABOR CABINETS LORD PRESIDENT OF THE COUNCIL, RICHARD CROSSMAN, SAID SUNDAY THAT MINISTERS FELT THAT THE CABINET COULD BEST HELP BY MOBILIZING WORLD OPINION IN SUPPORT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAKS.

CROSSMAN SAID THAT TRADE SANCTIONS AGAINST THE SOVIET UNION OR ITS WARSAW PACT ALLIES, AS SUGGESTED BY BACKBENCHERS OF BOTH BRITISH PARLIAMENTARY PARTIES, MIGHT HARM THE CZECHOSLOVAKS AS WELL.

HE ALSO WARNED THAT NOTHING SHOULD BE DONE TO PROVOKE FURTHER SOVIET ACTION AGAINST CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

CONSERVATIVE LEADER EDWARD HEATH IS MEETING WITH HIS "SHADOW CABINET" AT NOON TO DISCUSS POSSIBLE ACTION TO PROPOSE DURING THE DEBATE.

IN LONDON SUNDAY NIGHT, ABOUT A THOUSAND DEMONSTRATORS SHOUTED ANTI-SOVIET SLOGANS OUTSIDE THE SOVIET EMBASSY AND AT LEAST 19 PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED IN SCUFFLES WITH THE POLICE.
