THE DANISH PARTY'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE ALSO PUBLISHED A STATEMENT CALLING FOR THE WITHDRAWAL OF TROOPS WHOSE PRESENCE, IT SAID, WAS INCOMPATIBLE WITH THE PRINCIPLES OF SOCIALIST COOPERATION.

SWEDISH PARTY CHAIRMAN CARL-HENRIK HERMANSSON, WHO WENT TO PARIS SUNDAY, SAID HE PLANNED TO DISCUSS SUPPORT FOR CZECHOSLOVAKIA WITH FRENCH PARTY OFFICIALS.

SOUL-SEARCHING ON THE ISSUE CONTINUED IN THE FINNISH PARTY. CHAIRMAN AARNE SAARINEN EXPRESSED OPEN DOUBT SUNDAY ABOUT MOSCOW'S JUDGEMENT, BUT SECRETARY-GENERAL VILLE PESSI WARNED AGAINST SHAKING TIES WITH THE SOVIET UNION. THE FINNISH PARTY'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE ALSO SPLIT 24-11 IN BACKING A POLITBURO RESOLUTION SAYING IT COULD NOT RPT NOT UNDERSTAND THE INVASION.

THE SWISS PARTY CALLED AGAIN TODAY FOR A TROOP WITHDRAWAL AND SAID THE MOSCOW TALKS SHOULD BE ON THE BASIS OF EQUAL RIGHTS.

THE DUTCH PARTY'S PRESIDIUUM ALSO CONDEMNED THE INTERVENTION SUNDAY AND SAID IT WOULD ACT EVEN MORE STRONGLY AGAINST WHAT IT CALLED THE REVISIONIST VIOLATION BY THE SOVIET LEADERS OF MARXISM-LENINISM.
