X/4/9 C/S -- WARSAW COMMENTATOR ON MOSCOW TALKS

MUNICH, AUG 26 (CMD)-- RADIO WARSAW COMMENTATOR JAN ZAKRZEWSKI SAID TONIGHT THAT ALTHOUGH THE CZECHOSLOVAK-SOVIET TALKS IN MOSCOW WERE "DIFFICULT", THEY WERE AIMING FOR A SOLUTION TO THE PROBLEMS WHICH LED TO THE INVASION.

ZAKREWSKI, UNTIL RECENTLY RADIO WARSAW'S PARIS CORRESPONDENT, SAID THE POINT OF THE TALKS WAS "TO FIND A SOLUTION IN WHICH THE WESTERN FRONTIERS OF THE SOCIALIST CAMP IS PROPERLY SECURED AGAINST WEST GERMAN REVISIONISM AND MILITARISM, AND TO ENSURE THAT THIS REVISIONISM AND MILITARISM IS UNABLE TO FIND ANY DIRECT OR INDIRECT USE ^{OF} CZECHOSLOVAK MASS INFORMATION MEDIA FOR THEIR OWN IDEAS.

ZAKREWSKI SAID THAT IT WAS UNDERSTANDABLE THAT INFORMATION ABOUT THE TALKS HAD TO BE LIMITED IF THEY WERE TO ACHIEVE THEIR GOAL WITHOUT EXPLOITATION BY THE WESTERN PRESS.

ZAKREWSKI ALSO SAID THAT THE SITUATION IN PRAGUE WAS "SERIOUS AND TENSE."

THIS WAS THE WAY TO DESCRIBE THE PROBLEM "WHICH IN A NARROW WAY COULD BE CALLED THE MATTER OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC, AND IN THE LANGUAGE OF SOCIALIST INTERNATIONALISM ONE MUST CALL THE MATTER OF COHESION AND THE FUTURE OF THE AREA OF STATES WITH THE SOCIALIST SYSTEM LINKED BY THE "TIES OF NECESSARY COOPERATION."
