X/4 C/S - BUDAPEST ATTACKS YUGOSLAVIA

MUNICH, AUG 27 (CMD) - YUGOSLAV PRESIDENT JOSIP BROZ TITO BELIEVES MEMBERSHIP IN THE WARSAW PACT "MAKES IT IMPOSSIBLE FOR A COUNTRY TO FOLLOW ITS OWN COURSE," RADIO BUDAPEST CLAIMED LAST NIGHT.

IN AN ATTACK ON THE YUGOSLAV POSITION IN THE CZECHOSLOVAK CRISIS, THE RADIO SAID THAT THE YUGOSLAV LEAGUE OF COMMUNISTS SHOULD JUDGE THE WARSAW PACT INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA "WITH MORE RESPONSIBILITY."

"WE UNDERSTAND EVERYBODY WHO CONDEMNS DOGMATISM AND SECTARIANISM AND IS OF THE OPINION THAT THERE CAN BE SITUATIONS WHEN THESE MOSTLY JEOPARDIZE SOCIALISM.

"WE CAN ESPECIALLY WELL UNDERSTAND THE VERY MUCH JUSTIFIED ANTIPATHY OF THE COMMUNIST LEAGUE OF YUGOSLAVIA AGAINST DOGMATISM."

BUT STATEMENTS FROM YUGOSLAV LEADERS "CLAIM THAT THE FIVE COUNTRIES HAVE INTERFERED IN THE DOMESTIC AFFAIRS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA."

"YUGOSLAVIA SUPPORTS THE DEMANDS BY SAYING THAT CZECHOSLOVAKIA'S INDEPENDENCE AND TERRITORIAL INTEGRITY SHOULD BE RESPECTED TO ALLOW THE CZECHOSLOVAKS TO EXPRESS THEIR WILL IN A SOVEREIGN WAY," THE RADIO SAID.

"THIS STATEMENT DOES NOT CONSIDER WITH ADEQUATE RESPONSIBILITY WHETHER THE SOCIALIST SOCIAL ORDER, NATIONAL INDEPENDENCE AND ITS RELATION WITH THE SOCIALIST WORLD OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA HAS BEEN ENDANGERED," THE RADIO SAID.
