

MALAYSIAN STUDENTS UNHAPPY OVER CS EVENTS

KUALA LUMPUR, AUG. 27, REUTER - ABOUT 1,000 STUDENTS MARCHED ON THE HOME AFFAIRS MINISTRY HERE TODAY COMPLAINING OF ALLEGED POLICE BRUTALITY DURING PROTESTS LAST SATURDAY OVER THE SOVIET INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE MARCH WAS PEACEFUL BUT A SQUAD OF ABOUT 30 RIOT POLICE PREVENTED THE STUDENTS FROM ENTERING THE MINISTRY.

THEY WERE ALLOWED TO SEND IN A FOUR-MAN DELEGATION TO AIR THEIR GRIEVANCES.

ON SATURDAY POLICE USED TEAR GAS TO DISPERSE ABOUT 60 STUDENTS WHO STAGED A PROTEST OUTSIDE THE SOVIET DELEGATION WHILE THE AMBASSADOR, V. N. KUZNETSOV, WAS SPEAKING TO A DELEGATION OF FIVE THEY HAD SENT INSIDE.

NORWEGIANS TO CUT ALL SPORTS TIES WITH WAR SAW FIVE

OSLO, AUG 27 (UPI)--THE NORWEGIAN ATHLETICS FEDERATION TODAY ORDERED ALL ITS AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS TO CUT ALL FORMS OF ATHLETIC RELATIONS WITH THE SOVIET UNION, POLAND, EAST GERMANY, HUNGARY AND BULGARIA UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

THE BOARD OF THE NORWEGIAN OLYMPIC COMMITTEE SAID IT FULLY ENDORSED THE DECISION OF THE ATHLETICS FEDERATION.

DUTCH PAY SILENT TRIBUTE

THE HAGUE AUG 27, REUTER- TWO MINUTES SILENCE IS BEING OBSERVED IN HOLLAND AT 1300 MT TODAY TO EXPRESS DUTCH SYMPATHY FOR CZECHOSLOVAKIA. RADIO AND TELEVISION PROGRAMMES WILL ALSO BE STOPPED FOR TWO MINUTES.

TRAMS AND BUSES WILL STOP IN THE STREETS AND THE TWO MINUTES SILENCE WILL BE INDICATED BY SWITCHING ON STREET LIGHTING.
