

X/4 C/S -- SLOVAK PARTY CONGRESS IN SECOND DAY (RELEADS CN 40)

MUNICH, AUG. 27 (CMD) -- THE EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS OF THE SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY ENTERED ITS SECOND DAY IN BRATISLAVA TODAY WITH AN ANNOUNCEMENT THAT CZECHOSLOVAK PARTY LEADER ALEXANDER DUBCEK MAY TAKE PART, RADIO FREE DANUBE REPORTED.

DUBCEK AND OTHER CZECHOSLOVAK LEADERS RETURNED FROM MOSCOW THIS MORNING AFTER HOLDING TALKS WITH SOVIET LEADERS AT THE KREMLIN.

VICTOR PAVLEND, PRESIDING AT THE SLOVAK CONGRESS, TOLD DELEGATES THAT DEPUTY PREMIER GUSTAV HUSAK OR DUBCEK "MAY TAKE PART IN THE DEBATE."

PAVLEND ASKED THAT THE CONGRESS "POSTPONE THE DEBATING OF ALL QUESTIONS OF SUBSTANCE BY A FEW HOURS" TO ALLOW EITHER DUBCEK OR HUSAK TO ATTEND, THE BROADCAST SAID.

DUBCEK WAS SLOVAK PARTY LEADER BEFORE BEING ELEVATED TO THE LEADERSHIP OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK PARTY.

RADIO FREE DANUBE SAID THE PRESIDUM OF THE PARTY PROPOSED THAT THE MORNING SESSION OF THE CONGRESS, WHICH BEGAN AT 1000 MT, SHOULD BE DEVOTED TO DEBATE ON PROCEDURAL QUESTIONS AND ELECTION OF VARIOUS COMMISSIONS.
