MOSCOW, AUG. 27, REUTER - LEADERS OF THE FOUR WARSAW PACT STATES THAT JOINED THE SOVIET UNION IN INVADING CZECHOSLOVAKIA LEFT FOR HOME TODAY AFTER A SUMMIT MEETING AT WHICH THEY "ADOPTED AN APPROPRIATE DECISION" ON THE CRISIS, IT WAS ANNOUNCED HERE.

MOSCOW RADIO, QUOTING AN OFFICIAL COMMUNIQUE, SAID WLADYSLAW GOMULKA OF POLAND, WALTER ULBRICHT OF EAST GERMANY, JANOS KADAR OF HUNGARY AND TODOR ZHIVKOV OF BULGARIA HAD ALL MET SOVIET OFFICIALS.

THE ANNOUNCEMENT WAS THE FIRST OFFICIAL CONFIRMATION THAT THE LEADERS WERE HERE. IT SAID NOTHING ABOUT THEIR MEETING WITH THE CZECHOSLOVAK REPRESENTATIVES WHO LEFT EARLY TODAY.
