X/4 CS - HUSAK SAYS TALKS ABOUT TROOP DEPARTURE EXPECTED

MUNICH, AUG 27 (CMD)- CZECHOSLOVAK DEPUTY PREMIER DR. GUSTAV HUSAK SAID TODAY TALKS ABOUT "CONCRETE DATES" CONCERNING THE DEPARTURE OF WARSAW PACT TROOPS WILL BEGIN "ACCORDING TO A PRELIMINARY AGREEMENT IN ABOUT TEN TO 14 DAYS."

HUSAK MADE THE STATEMENT IN A SPEECH TO THE EXTRAORDINARY CONGRESS OF THE SLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY WHICH BEGAN IN BRATISLAVA YESTERDAY.

A REPORT ON HIS SPEECH WAS CARRIED BY THE "DANUBE" RADIO TONIGHT (1913).

HUSAK REPORTED ABOUT THE SOVIET-CSSR NEGOTIATIONS IN MOSCOW AND DESCRIBED THE AGREEMENT REACHED AS AN "HONORABLE" ONE. HE SAID IT WILL ENABLE THE CONSOLIDATION OF THE POLITICAL AND ECONOMIC SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY IN A RELATIVELY SHORT PERIOD.

THE RADIO SAID THAT THE SLOVAK PARTY CONGRESS WILL CONTINUE TOMORROW.

IN ANOTHER REPORT THE RADIO SAID THAT A DELEGATION OF THE SLOVAK NATIONAL COUNCIL (PARLIAMENT) WILL LEAVE FOR PRAGUE BY THURSDAY AT THE LATEST TO DISCUSS ALL IMPORTANT QUESTIONS AND TASKS WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF THE CZECH NATIONAL COUNCIL.

RADIO CENTRAL SLOVAKIA SAID LATER TONIGHT (1920) THAT THE SLOVAK NATIONAL COUNCIL WILL MEET TOMORROW MORNING IN BRATISLAVA.
