CS - 1ST ADD - CROWDS MARCH (CN 304) X X X INTERFERE

DURING THE DEMONSTRATION, THE CROWD JEERED AT BYSTANDERS IN SHOP DOORWAYS WHO DID NOT JOIN THE PROCESSION.

AS THE MARCHERS THROGGED THE ENTRANCE TO PARLIAMENT, A DEPUTY, ALOIS POLDNIAK, TOLD THEM FROM A FIRST FLOOR WINDOW: "PARLIAMENT WILL NOT ENDORSE ANY AGREEMENT THAT IS AGAINST OUR FREEDOM TO SPEAK AND TO WRITE, OR AGAINST OUR SOVEREIGNTY."

THERE WAS A GREAT ROAR OF APPROVAL WHEN HE ADDED, "PARLIAMENT DOES NOT AGREE WITH THE MOSCOW COMMUNIQUE."

"WE WILL DO OUR BEST TO MAKE THIS REPUBLIC DEMOCRATIC, SOVEREIGN AND FREE."

MR. POLEDNAK SAID THE SOVIET OCCUPATION WAS AN "AGGRESSIVE ACT," BUT AT THE SAME TIME HE CALLED ON THE YOUTHS TO AVOID "PROVOCATIONS."
