

WORLD -- THE DAY AHEAD

MUNICH, AUG 28 (CNR) -- PRAGUE REMAINS THE FOCUS OF ATTENTION TODAY AS THE WORLD AWAITS FURTHER REACTION TO THE MOSCOW TALKS AGREEMENT IN THE WAKE OF THE SOVIET-LED WARSAW PACT OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE MOSCOW TALKS AGREEMENT WAS RECEIVED INITIALLY WITH MIXED FEELINGS BY THE CZECHOSLOVAKS ALTHOUGH THERE HAVE BEEN APPEALS FOR CALM AND AN APPRECIATION OF THE CRITICAL SITUATION.

THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY'S CENTRAL COMMITTEE WHICH MET YESTERDAY TO DISCUSS THE SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY WILL RESUME ITS SESSION AT 1000 MT TODAY.

DEVELOPMENTS ARE ALSO EXPECTED TODAY ON THE ISSUE FROM THE SLOVAK PARTY CONGRESS AND THE SLOVAK NATIONAL COUNCIL WHICH ARE SCHEDULED TO MEET TODAY.

THE U.N. IS EXPECTED TO REPLY TODAY TO A CZECHOSLOVAK REQUEST FOR THE SECURITY COUNCIL TO DROP ITS DEBATE ON THE CRISIS.

PROTESTS AT THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA CONTINUED TO ROLL AROUND THE WORLD YESTERDAY AND MORE DEMONSTRATIONS OF SUPPORT FOR THE CZECHOSLOVAKS ARE LIKELY TODAY.

IN PARIS, THE U.S. AND NORTH VIETNAMESE NEGOTIATORS MEET TODAY FOR THE 19TH TIME SINCE THE PRELIMINARY PEACE TALKS ON THE VIETNAM WAR OPENED ON MAY 13.

IN CHICAGO, THE VIETNAM WAR WILL FIGURE PROMINENTLY IN TODAY'S DEBATES AT THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY'S NATIONAL CONVENTION. THE PARTY WILL CHOOSE ITS PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE LATER TODAY.

MEANWHILE, THE NIGERIAN CIVIL WAR IS BACK IN THE WORLD'S NEWS AGAIN TODAY AS ADVANCING NIGERIAN FEDERAL TROOPS SWEEP TOWARDS THE MAJOR BIAFRAN CITY OF ABA IN A FINAL OFFENSIVE AGAINST THE BREAKAWAY STATE.
