X/4/9 C/S - WARSAW SAYS YESTERDAY'S EVENTS LESSENED TENSION IN PRAGUE

MUNICH, AUG 28 (CMD) -- RADIO WARSAW SAID THIS MORNING THAT "YESTERDAY'S POLITICAL EVENTS HAVE LESSENED POLITICAL TENSION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA".

THE RADIO REFERRED IN THIS CONNECTION TO THE RETURN OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK DELEGATION FROM MOSCOW, THE GOVERNMENT SESSION UNDER PREMIER OLDRICH CERNIK WITH THE PRESENCE OF PRESIDENT LUDVIK SVOBODA, THE MEETING OF THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY, WHICH HEARD A REPORT PRESENTED BY ITS CHAIRMAN JOSEF SMRKOVSKY, AND TO THE PUBLICATION OF THE FULL TEXT OF THE COMMUNIQUE ON THE MOSCOW TALKS BY RADIO PRAGUE AT 1500 MT.

THE BROADCAST SAID PEOPLE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA WERE DISCUSSING IN THE STREETS THE INDIVIDUAL QUESTIONS MENTIONED IN THE COMMUNIQUE, AND "ABOVE ALL ARE DRAWING ATTENTION TO THE NECESSITY OF THE NORMALIZATION OF RELATIONS IN THE COUNTRY.

"THE SPEECH OF THE AGED PRESIDENT OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIAL REPUBLIC, LUDVIK SVOBODA AND ALSO THE SPEECH OF THE FIRST SECRETARY OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE ALEXANDER DUBCEK HAVE BEEN RECEIVED WITH GREAT ATTENTION," SAID THE RADIO.

"THE OPINION PREVAILS THAT THE RESULTS OF THE MOSCOW TALKS ARE THE BEST AND STRICTLY SPEAKING THE ONLY POSSIBLE WAY OUT OF THE CRISIS IN WHICH CZECHOSLOVAKIA FOUND ITSELF," SAID THE RADIO.
