CZECHOSLOVAK CITIZENS "INVITED" TO GO HOME

ROME , AUG. 28 (UPI)--THE CZECHOSLOVAK EMBASSY TODAY TOLD ALL CZECHOSLOVAK CITIZENS WHO HAVE DELAYED THEIR RETURN HOME BECAUSE OF THE OCCUPATION THAT THINGS WERE RETURNING TO NORMAL AND THEY WERE "INVITED" TO GO BACK.

THE EMBASSY SAID ALL NORMAL METHODS OF TRANSPORT WERE OPERATING AGAIN AND THE BORDER POINTS BETWEEN AUSTRIA AND CZECHOSLOVAKIA WERE OPEN.

FRENCH WOMENS FRONT GROUP PROTESTS

PARIS, AUGUST 28 (RFE SPECIAL/EDWARDS) - - - THE COMMUNIST-LED UNION OF FRENCH WOMEN HAS CONDEMNED THE INVASION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA AS "CONTRARY TO THE PRINCIPLES OF THE SOVEREIGNTY OF STATES, NON-INTERFERENCE AND THE RIGHT OF SELF-DETERMINATION."

IN ITS STATEMENT., PUBLISHED TODAY BY THE FRENCH COMMUNIST PARTY DAILY, L'HUMANITE, THE ORGANIZATION VOICES THE HOPE THAT THE MOSCOW AGREEMENTS WILL "LEAD TO A RETURN TO A NORMAL LIFE IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA, NOTABLY BY THE WITHDRAWAL OF FOREIGN FORCES."

THE UNION HAS SENT COPIES OF ITS DECLARATION TO THE WOMENS UNIONS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND THE FIVE INVADING COUNTRIES AND TO THE PANKOW HEADQUARTERS OF THE INTERNATIONAL DEMOCRATIC FEDERATION OF WOMEN.
