

X/4 CS- BUDAPEST ON CZECHOSLOVAK SITUATION

MUNICH, AUGUST 29 (CMD)-- RADIO BUDAPEST SAID TODAY THAT IT HAD BEEN KNOWN THAT HUNGARY WOULD SEND MILITARY "AID" TO CZECHOSLOVAKIA SHOULD WORKING CLASS POWER BE ENDANGERED.

IN A COMMENTARY ON THE SOVIET-CZECHOSLOVAK TALKS, THE RADIO SAID THAT "OUR PARTY SUPPORTED FROM THE BEGINNING THE NEW POLICY OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK FRATERNAL PARTY, BUT IT WAS ALSO KNOWN THAT SHOULD CZECHOSLOVAK WORKER'S POWER GET INTO A SERIOUS SITUATION, OUR PARTY WOULD GIVE AID, INCLUDING MILITARY AID TO THE WORKING CLASS."

"THIS PRINCIPLE IS ENFORCED BY THE ALLIED TROOPS WHICH ARE STAYING IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA UNDER MUTUAL AGREEMENT THERE IS A SATISFACTORY SETTLEMENT OF THE DOMESTIC SITUATION AND WHICH, AS THE COMMUNIQUE OF THE SOVIET- CZECHOSLOVAK TALKS STRESSED, ARE NOT RPT NOT INTERFERING IN THE DOMESTIC AFFAIRS OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK SOCIALIST REPUBLIC", THE RADIO SAID.

THE RADIO SAID THE "MAIN TASK NOW IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA WAS "TO RESTORE PUBLIC ORDER, TO RETAIN CONTROL OVER THE UNDERMINING WORK OF THE DOMESTIC AND FOREIGN ENEMY".

THE RADIO SAID IT WAS "VERY URGENT" TO REGAIN CONTROL, AND AS AN EXAMPLE SAID THAT AS SOON AS PRESIDENT LUDVIK SVOBODA FINISHED HIS RADIO SPEECH A CZECH-LANGUAGE RADIO STATION CAME ON THE AIR "TAKING A STAND AGAINST THE (MOSCOW) AGREEMENT".

CZECHOSLOVAK PARTY LEADER "ALEXANDER DUBCEK HAD CONDEMNED IRRESPONSIBLE FORCES IN HIS SPEECH, BUT THIS HAD NOT PREVENTED

THEM ORGANIZING BLUSTERS AGAINST THE LEADERSHIP CZECHOSLOVAK PARTY AND GOVERNMENT.
