X/4 C/S - HUNGARY SAYS CS FACE "DIFFICULT STRUGGLE"

MUNICH, AUGUST 29 (CMD)- RADIO BUDAPEST SAID TODAY IN A BROADCAST TO HUNGARIANS ABROAD THAT THE CZECHOSLOVAK PEOPLE AND ITS LEADERSHIP FACE "VERY DIFFICULT STRUGGLES."

COMMENTING ON THE SOVIET-CZECHOSLOVAK TALKS THE RADIO SAID THAT "HUNGARIAN PUBLIC OPINION RECEIVED THE SUCCESSFUL CONCLUSION (OF THE MOSCOW TALKS) WITH RELIEF."

"IT WAS NOT RPT NOT EASY TO MAKE THE DECISION BUT POLITICAL REALITY AND THE POSSIBILITY OF A STRONG RIGHT-WING CHANGE NEEDED DECISION", THE BROADCAST SAID.

"THE STRUGGLE HAS NOT RPT NOT BEEN ENDED AND A COMPLETE DEVELOPMENT CAN BE ONLY REACHED BY POLITICAL MEANS", THE RADIO SAID.

IT SAID THAT "VERY DIFFICULT STRUGGLES ARE AWAITING THE LEADERS OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA, ITS WORKING CLASS AND COMMUNIST PARTY", AND ADDED:

"THIS COMPLICATED ROAD OF STRUGGLE FULL OF CONTRADICTION IS WELL KNOWN EXACTLY IN HUNGARY WHEN ONE HAS TO STRUGGLE NOT ONLY AGAINST THE ENEMY BUT ALSO FOR CONVINCING EXCITED PEOPLE INFLUENCED BY THE FAULTS OF THE OLD LEADERSHIP AND THE SLANDERS OF THE ENEMY."
