X/4 C/S -- MORNING INTRO - STATEMENTS PLEDGE SUPPORT FOR DUBCEK

MUNICH, AUGUST 29 -- (CMD) -- STATEMENTS, MESSAGES AND LETTERS READ BY CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATIONS LAST NIGHT PLEDGED SUPPORT FOR PARTY LEADER ALEXANDER DUBCEK, PRESIDENT LUDVIK SVOBODA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

(CNR) - THE STATEMENTS FOLLOW A GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCEMENT LAST NIGHT THAT IT WAS FORMULATING A NEW MESSAGE TO THE FIVE WARSAW PACT OCCUPYING POWERS.

PREMIER OLDRICH CERNIK, IN A RADIO SPEECH, ALSO ANNOUNCED THAT HE WOULD REMAIN IN HIS POST, AND TOLD HIS COUNTRYMEN THAT COOL HEADS WERE NEEDED IN THE PRESENT SITUATION. THE ONLY WAY OUT, HE SAID, WAS A POLITICAL SOLUTION.

SOME OF THE LATEST STATEMENTS REPORTED BY CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATIONS CONTAIN APPEALS TO KEEP DISCIPLINE AND ACKNOWLEDGED THAT THE CZECHOSLOVAK DELEGATION DID EVERYTHING IN THEIR POWER DURING THE RECENT NEGOTIATIONS WITH SOVIET LEADERS IN MOSCOW.

SOME OF THE STATEMENTS CONTINUED TO EXPRESS DISAPPOINTMENT OVER THE COMMUNIQUE ON THE MOSCOW TALKS.

A STATEMENT BY THE UNION OF STUDENTS IN BOHEMIA AND MORAVIA WAS BROADCAST LAST NIGHT BY THE RADIO STATION CZECHOSLOVAKIA ONE.

THE STATEMENT SAID WHAT WAS INVOLVED IN MOSCOW WAS THE SOLUTION OF A GIVEN SITUATION, WHILE NOW THE "POLITICAL STRUGGLE" HAD TO BE FOUGHT OUT.

"LET US STAND BEHIND THE COMMUNIST PARTY AND ITS 14TH CONGRESS, THEY ARE THE FIRMEST PART OF OUR NATIONS," THE STATEMENT SAID (2219).
