

## WORLD -- THE DAY AHEAD

MUNICH, AUG. 29 (CNR)--THE WORLD TODAY AWAITS FURTHER MOVES TOWARD RESOLUTION OF THE SITUATION IN CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCED IT WAS FORMULATING A NEW MESSAGE TO THE FIVE WARSAW PACT OCCUPYING POWERS, PREMIER OLDŘICH ČERNÍK STATED THAT HE WOULD REMAIN IN OFFICE, AND CZECHOSLOVAK RADIO STATIONS WEDNESDAY NIGHT BROADCAST STATEMENTS, MESSAGES AND LETTERS PLEDGING SUPPORT TO PARTY LEADER ALEXANDER DUBČEK, PRESIDENT LUDVÍK SVOBODA, AND THE CZECHOSLOVAK GOVERNMENT.

THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE OF THE RUMANIAN PARTY CENTRAL COMMITTEE WEDNESDAY HAD ISSUED A STATEMENT STRESSING THE IMPORTANCE OF THE WITHDRAWAL FROM CZECHOSLOVAKIA OF THE TROOPS OF THE FIVE OCCUPYING WARSAW PACT POWERS.

IN THE UNITED STATES, THE CHOICE OF A PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE BY THE DEMOCRATIC PARTY TODAY IS EXPECTED TO CLIMAX A FREQUENTLY-CHAOTIC NATIONAL CONVENTION SITE, WHILE THE FLOOR PROCEEDINGS AT TIMES GOT BEYOND THE CONTROL OF CONVENTION OFFICIALS.

THE CHOICE OF A VICE-PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATE WAS TO BE MADE AT A LATER SESSION TODAY.

SOME 90 NON-NUCLEAR NATIONS ARE TO OPEN A CONFERENCE IN GENEVA TODAY ON THE IMPLICATIONS FOR THEM OF THE NUCLEAR NON-PROLIFERATION TREATY. FOUR NUCLEAR POWERS -- THE UNITED STATES, THE SOVIET UNION, BRITAIN AND FRANCE -- WILL TAKE PART AS OBSERVERS. THE OTHER NUCLEAR POWER, CHINA, REFUSED TO TAKE PART.

ON THE LIGHTER SIDE, NORWEGIANS AND MANY FIGURES OF EUROPEAN ROYALTY TODAY WILL CELEBRATE THE MARRIAGE OF NORWAY'S CROWN PRINCE HARALD TO A COMMONER, MISS SONJA HARALDSEN, IN OSLO'S CATHEDRAL.
