X/4 CS - FOCK REPORT ON MOSCOW TALKS

MUNICH, AUG 29 (CMD)- HUNGARIAN PREMIER JENOE FOCK REPORTED TO THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS TODAY ON "THE RECENT MOSCOW TALKS OF THE PARTY AND GOVERNMENT DELEGATIONS OF THE FIVE SOCIALIST COUNTRIES" RADIO BUDAPEST REPORTS.

(THE LEADERS OF THE SOVIET UNION, POLAND, EAST GERMANY, HUNGARY AND BULGARIA - THE FIVE COUNTRIES WHOSE FORCES ARE OCCUPYING CZECHOSLOVAKIA - MET IN MOSCOW AT THE WEEKEND AFTER THE SOVIET-CZECHOSLOVAK TALKS. SOVIET NEWS MEDIA SAID THE MEETING DISCUSSED CZECHOSLOVAKIA, BUT NO FURTHER DETAILS WERE GIVEN.)

RADIO BUDAPEST SAID THE COUNCIL AGREED TO FOCK'S REPORT.

"MINISTERS CONCERNED, REPORTED ON THE MEASURES TAKEN AND ALSO PLANNED TO SOLVE THE PROBLEMS CONCERNING THE HUNGARIAN-CZECHOSLOVAK TRANSPORT, TRADE AND TOURIST RELATIONS."

THE COUNCIL OF MINISTERS APPOINTED THE HUNGARIAN DELEGATION TO BE PARTICIPATE IN THE 23RD UN GENERAL MEETING, THE RADIO SAID, AND ADDED THAT THE DELEGATION WILL BE HEADED BY HUNGARIAN FOREIGN MINISTER JANOS PETER. (RADIO BUDAPEST DOMESTIC/M, AUG 29/2113 AND FOR HUNGARIANS ABROAD, 2130)
