

"A MEETING BETWEEN THE REPRESENTATIVES OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA AND THE FIVE COUNTRIES OF THE WARSAW PACT SHOULD TAKE PLACE SOON TO DEFINE THE PARTICULARS AND THE TIME OF THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE ALLIED TROOPS," HE SAID.

"THIS NATURALLY IF AND WHEN THE LEADERS OF THE SIX SOCIALIST COUNTRIES WILL BE IN AGREEMENT IN DEFINING 'NORMALIZED' OR 'ON THE WAY TO RAPID NORMALIZATION'...

"NOTHING IS KNOWN YET ON THE LEVEL OF THE NEW PROBABLE SUMMIT, BUT IN MOSCOW, POLITICAL OBSERVERS THINK THAT ONCE A PRELIMINARY AGREEMENT IS REACHED ON THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE ARMED FORCES, THE RELATIVE TECHNICAL PROBLEMS CAN BE CONFRONTED DIRECTLY BY REPRESENTATIVES OF THE VARIOUS MILITARY UNITS.

"THE NEWS OF THE NEW POSSIBLE ENCOUNTER WAS GIVEN IN PRAGUE BY PRIME MINISTER CERNIK AND IN MOSCOW IT WAS NOT RPT NOT DENIED EVEN IF TASS GIVING NEWS OF CERNIK'S SPEECH DID NOT RPT NOT SPEAK OF THE PART RELATIVE TO THE PRESENCE IN THE COUNTRY OF TROOPS.

"... THERE IS ALSO TALK OF A FORTHCOMING MEETING BETWEEN CZECHOSLOVAKS AND SOVIETS ON ECONOMIC MATTERS," GUERRA ADDED.

"IT IS OBVIOUS THAT CZECHOSLOVAKIA NOW NEEDS IMMEDIATE AND CONCRETE AID. BUT ALL THIS IS CONDITIONED-- THEY SAY IN THE COUNTRY."

SERGIO MUGNAI'S DISPATCH FROM BUCHAREST DEALT WITH THE CENTRAL COMMITTEE'S COMMUNIQUE "NOTING" THE PRAGUE-MOSCOW COMPROMISE.
