C/S -1600 INTRO: COMMUNIST CRITICISM

MUNICH, AUG. 30 (CNR) RUMANIA AND YUGOSLAVIA TODAY MAINTAINED THEIR CRITICISM OF THE OCCUPATION OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA.

THE BELGRADE DAILY, POLITIKA, CHARGED TODAY THAT THE SOVIET NEWS AGENCY TASS' ATTACKS ON YUGOSLAV SUPPORT OF THE PRAGUE LEADERSHIP WERE SIMILAR TO THOSE USED BY STALIN 20 YEARS AGO.

THE YUGOSLAV PRESS AGENCY, TANJUG SAID LAST NIGHT THE SOLUTION OF THE CRISIS REQUIRED MEETING THE "JUST REQUESTS" OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK COMMUNIST PARTY AND THE WITHDRAWAL OF THE OCCUPYING ARMED FORCES.

IN RUMANIA, COMMUNIST PARTY LEADER NICOLAE CEAUSESCU SAID TODAY THAT HIS COUNTRY WOULD STRUGGLE TO OVERCOME THE "GRAVE MOMENT" CREATED BY THE CZECHOSLOVAK INVASION, ACCORDING TO RADIO BUCHAREST.

CEAUSESCU, ACCOMPANIED BY PREMIER ION GHEORGHE MAURER, WAS ADDRESSING A MEETING OF WORKERS AT TURDA, WEST RUMANIA, DURING A TOUR OF THE CLUJ REGION.

THE RADIO SAID THAT THE OFFICIALS' WARM RECEPTION BY LOCAL CITIZENS SHOWED THE PEOPLE'S FULL ENDORSEMENT OF PARTY POLICY, WHICH HAS CRITICIZED THE CZECHOSLOVAK INVASION.

AT A MEETING OF SECURITY FORCE WORKERS YESTERDAY IN BUCHAREST, CEAUSESCU HAD ALSO SAID THAT THE RUMANIAN PEOPLE WANTED TO SHAPE THEIR OWN DESTINY AS THEY PLEASED. N
