X/4 C/S - BUDAPEST SAYS COMPLETE CALM IN PRAGUE

MUNICH, AUGUST 30, (CMD)-- RADIO BUDAPEST QUOTED TODAY THE HUNGARIAN NEWS AGENCY MTI'S PRAGUE CORRESPONDENT GYOERGY HALASI AS SAYING THAT "THERE IS COMPLETE CALM AND NO RPT NO DISTURBING CIRCUMSTANCES IN THE WHOLE OF CZECHOSLOVAKIA IN THE LAST 24 HOURS".

HE SAID THAT "A BIGGER SOVIET TANK UNIT, CONCENTRATED IN THE SIDE STREETS, LEFT THE CENTER OF PRAGUE DURING THE NIGHT".

THE NEW MAYOR OF THE CZECHOSLOVAK CAPITAL AND THE PRESIDENTS OF DISTRICT NATIONAL COMMITTEES ARE DISCUSSING QUESTIONS CONCERNING THE GRADUAL NORMALIZATION OF THE LIFE OF THE CITY, HALASI SAID.

HE SAID THE BURGOMASTER AND THE PRESIDENTS HAVE ANNOUNCED THAT THE SCHOOL-YEAR WILL BEGIN ON SEPTEMBER TWO.
